The Hybl Fellowship Program at IFES' Applied Research Center brings outstanding graduate students to Washington, D.C., each year to research democracy development, election administration and civic participation in the political process.

Eligibility



The Hybl Fellowship is open to students who completed their undergraduate studies and are working towards a graduate degree in International Relations, Political Science, Public Administration or a related area at a university in one of the following states: Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming. The fellowship is ideally suited for students in a Master's or PhD program who are exploring the aforementioned areas of interest for their dissertation research. Research proposals with an applied focus are preferred.

The F. Clifton White Applied Research Center for Democracy and Elections (ARC)

ARC generates innovative applied research to enhance the practice of democracy-building and bolster development of democratic and participatory institutions, processes and culture. As a premiere collection, the F. Clifton White Collection within ARC contains more than 6,500 books, periodicals, country reports, and briefings, as well as posters, ballots, fliers, handbills and other election-related materials on election administration and democracy-building material from around the world.
