You have applied for a ballot to vote absentee. The ballot is enclosed in sealed envelope marked BALLOT WITHIN: DO NOT OPEN EXCEPT IN THE PRESENCE OF A WITNESS.

BEFORE VOTING

1. Do not open the envelope marked **BALLOT WITHIN** until in the presence of the witness. If voting in the office of a Virginia election official, the witness must be a Registrar or Secretary of the Electoral Board. After removing the ballot, mark it in the presence of the witness but without assistance and without making known to the witness how you vote. If you are physically or educationally unable to vote without assistance, see Item 7 on the reverse side of this form.

TO VOTE:

- 2. In the square immediately to the left of the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote, place a cross (X or +), or a check (*), or a line(-), leaving the square to the left of those for whom you do not wish to vote unmarked.
