To vote for all of the electors of a party, FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square opposite the na presidential candidates of that party. A filled-in rectangle in the square opposite the name of a party and its candidates is a vote for all of the electors of that party, but for no other candidates.

To vote for those electors who have pledged themselves to vote for a candidate for President and Vic particular party, FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square opposite the names of those presidential and vio

To vote for those electors who have pledged themselves to vote for a candidate for President and for qualified to participate in the election, write in the names and party of those presidential and vice president provided for that purpose and FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square opposite the names you have writ

To vote for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot, FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square to Where two or more candidates for the same office are to be elected, FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the squ candidates for the office for whom you desire to vote, not to exceed, however, the number of candidate

To vote for a qualified WRITE-IN candidate, write the person's name in the blank space provided for the other candidates for the same office and FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square to the right of the name will not be counted.

To vote on any measure, FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square after the word "YES" or after the wo

All distinguishing marks or erasures are forbidden and make the ballot void.

If you wrongly mark, tear or deface any portion of your ballot cards, replace the cards in the secrecy h Board Member and obtain another set.

MAKE SURE YOU VOTE BOTH SIDES OF YOUR BALLOT CARDS.


