## INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS

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To vote for al of the presidential candidates of that party. A filled-in rectangle in the square opposite the name of a party and its presidential and vice presidential To vote for a vote for all of the electors of that party, but for no other candidates.
To vote for those electors who have pledged themselves to vote for a candidate for President and Vice President not supported by any particular partty, FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square opposite the names of those presidential and vice presidential candidates. To vote for those electors who have pledged themselves to vote for a candidate for President and antial candidates in the blank space qualified to participate in en election, provided for that purpose and FIL INE RECTANGLE in the square opposite the names you have written in.
To vote for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot, FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square to the right of the candidate's name. Where two or more candidates for the same office are to be elected, FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square to the right of the names of all candidates for the office for whom you desire to vote, not to exceed, however, the number of candidates to be elected.
To vote for a qualified WRITE-IN candidate, write the persor's name in the blank space provided for that purpose after the names of the other candidates for

To vote on any measure, FILL IN THE RECTANGLE in the square after the word "YES" or after the word "NO.
All distinguishing marks or erasures are forbidden and make the ballot void.
If you wrongly mark, tear or deface any portion of your ballot cards, replace the cards in the secrecy holder and return it to the Precinct Board Member and obtain another set.
MAKE SURE YOU VOTE BOTH SIDES OF YOUR BALLOT CARDS, At, along with the marking pen, to the Precinct Board Member who shall, in the presence of the voter, remove numbered stubs, hand same it, along with the marking pen, to the Precinct Board

## STEP 2

VIOTE ONE CARD AT A TIME (Vote Both Sides). Fill in the small rectangle in the square to the right of the candidates or measures of your choice.

DO' NOT FILL IN THE WHOLE SQUARE, JUST THE SMALL RECTANGLE, OR YOUR VOTE MAY NOT BE COUNTED. Use only the marking pen provided to mark your ballot.

## STEP 3

After you have completed voting, place your ballot cards, with the stubs at the top, in the secrecy holder and hand it, along with the marking pen, to the Precinct Officer.
