


It is therefore pressing and indispensable to undertake to popularize the rules of law and the principles of good governance to ensure that Africans would become educated, alert and enlightened citizens.




In 1996, ELICA and EMFP (Election Monitoring and Education Projet) were launched in the same perspective.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS

- * A vote is the expression of a sovereign people. No one may vote on behave of another except at the request of voter who is equally present.
- * Any citizen aged at least 20 years irrespective of his sex, religion, must be concerned with election issues.
- * Election constitutes the basis of democracy and democracy sustain development.
- * Registration on voter registers begin on January 1st each year. Don't forget to collect your voter's card before elections.
- * Members of the Registration commission should ease up the task of voters. They ensure compliance with the law as any person guilty or corruption is punishable by the law.
- * Getting the population informed of the rules of the political game and the election process is a requirement in democracy.
- * During election campaign, try to ask questions to candidates about their action programme, as only coherent programmes and the moral integrite of candidates should determine your choice. Never be influenced by "Campaign presents".
- * On election day get up early. Take your breakfast, and then your National Identity Card and your Voter registration Card and go to the polling station that you would located the day before.
- * During elections any voter has the right to signal any irregularity and to report it in a very polite manner to the President of the polling station or to any competent authority.
- * During voting operations, the voter must have a worthy attitude. He must not disrupt the voting operation. This means he must respect

others, must not push them, insult them or cause fighting. No one may enter the polling station with arms or alcoholic drinks. Equally, there should be no advertisement. People must be tolerant and accept differences.

- * No one has the right to apply justice through violent means. The law enables recours to justice free of charge in case of election differences.
- * When you are among the last to vote, you have the right to take part in the counting operation. It is often necessary to take along a torch of or a lamp as there may be light failure at anytime. All this must be done in order and discipline as the President may send out anybody for pool behaviour.
- * Any voter can also be elected as municipal councilor, member of parliament or President of the Republic if he fulfills all the conditions required by law.
- * An election is a game, a competition where the victory of the best must be accepted by all. There must be fair play and respect of the verdict of the election.

How to get registered: you're 20 years old, so take your National Identity Card. Go straight to your quarter head and get yourself registered on a voter register.

What should I do if my name does not appear on the voter register? Just apply to the Divisional Officer at anytime.

Watch out: registration of voters begins on January 1 each year and end when the electoral corps is convened.

Supplement: some excerpts of the Electoral code A-Law N°. 92-002 of 14 August 1992

Section 6

- (1) Every Cameroonian citizen anjoying the right to vote as definied in this law who has a place of abode in a council or has a place of abode in a council or has actually been therein for a last 6 (six) months shall be entitled to have his name entered on the register of electors for such council.
- (2) Every Cameroonian citizen who does not satisfy the requirements concerning age, residence and place of abode specified in Sub-section 1 above at the time of the revision of the registers of electors shall further be entitled to have his name entered on the register of electors provided he shall satisfy such requirements on or before the date on which the register is finally closed.

B-Law Nº 91-020 of 16 December 1991

Section 11

Every person of Cameroonian nationality or any naturalized Cameroonian, of either sex, who has reached the age of 20 years and is not under any of the disqualifications laid down by law, shall be entitled to be an elector.

Section 99

(1) No person shall be allowed to vote unless his name appears on the register of electors of the polling station concerned.

Section 49

(2) Entry on the register of electors shall be as of right and shall be carried out by or under the control of the Subdivisional Officer in close collaboration with the political parties operating in his area of jurisdiction.

Section 51

No person may have his name entered on more than one register of electors.

Section 52

Registers of electors shall be permanent. They shall be revised every year throughout the Republic. Senior Divisional Officers may order a thorough recompilation of the registers at the time of the annual revision.

Section 53

The annual revision of registers of electors shall commence on 1 january of each year throughout the Republic and shall be carried out in accordance with the following provisions:

a) Any citizen who statisfies the age and residence requirements to be registered as elector and any citizen who satisfies such requirements but whose name has been from such register may apply for registration to the Subdivision! Officer, even outside the time fixed for the annual revision of registers.

Section 54

(1) The revision Commission provided for under Section 29 of this law shall record in the register of electors the names of citizens whom it deems to have satisfy, the requirements laid down by the law, those who satisfy the age and residence requirements before the end of the delibererations of the Revision Commission and those names where previously omitted.

Section 55

(1) During the revision of registers of electors, a copy of the register shall be submitted to the council or subdivisional office and may be consulted by any person. During such period, any citizen whose name has been omitted from register may apply for registration.

Section 65

Every elector whose name has been entered on a register of electors shall be issued a registration card which shall indicate his full name, date of birth, filiation, occupation, residence or place of abode.

Law N° 97-020 of 9 September 1997

Section 110: Whoever:

- a) Cause his name to be entered on a regsiter of electors under a false identity and, causing himself to be registered conceals a disqualification provided for by this law or claims the entry of his name on two or more registers;
- b) Causes his name to be improperly entered on a register of electors by means of fraudulers statements or false certificates, or by similar devices wrongly enters on or strikes off a register of electors the name of any citizen;
- c) Having been deprived of the right to vote participates in the election;
- d) Records a vote either by virtue of being fraudulently registered or by impersonating registered elector;
- e) By reason of the fact that his name appears on more that one register of electors vote more than once :
- f) Being responsible a the polls for receiving, counting or verifying the envelopes containing ballot papers withdraws, adds to or alters any ballot paper or reads a name other than the name actually appearing thereon;
- g) By spreading false news, false rumours or by other fraudulent devices reduces the number of votes or misappropriates same and influences an elector or electors to abstain from voting;
- h) In any of the commissions provided for in this law, either in a polling or in a Government office before, during or after and regulations or by any other fraudulent device, violates the secrecy of the ballot, affects the genuineness of the election, obstructs the counting of votes or alters the result thereof:
- i) Is guilty of fraud in the issue or production of a certificate showing that the name of a person is entered on or has been struck off the register of electors;
- j) On the day of election either as principal offender or accomplee, whether or not with force fraudulently removes or takes awy a ballot-box shall be liable to the penalties laid down under Section 122 of the Penal Code.
- 2) Where the offender or his accomplice is a public servant within the meaning of Section 13 of the Penal Code, he shall be liable to the penalties laid under Section 141 of the Penal Code.
