



USING THE VOTING DEVICE

Step 1: Using both hands, insert the Official Ballot all the way into the Voting Device.




Step 2: Be sure the two holes of your Official Ballot fit down over the two red pins.



Step 3: To vote, hold the voting instrument straight up. Punch straight down through the Official Ballot for each of your choices.

Do not use pen or pencil.



- **Step 4:** After voting, remove the Official Ballot from the Voting Device and inspect it to be sure rectangular shaped holes were cleanly and completely punched out.
- Step 5: Fold the Official Ballot at the perforation (as demonstrated at the polls), with the stub showing, and return it to a Precinct Official.

Note: If you make a mistake, return your Official Ballot and obtain another.

TO EXPEDITE YOUR VOTING

BEFORE GOING TO THE POLLS:

- 1. Mark your voting choices in your Sample Official Ballot.
- 2. On the chart to the right, mark the boxes below the numbers that match the numbers you have marked in your Sample Official Ballot.

AT THE POLLS:

- 1. Insert the official ballot card into the voting device provided.
- 2. Take the voting instrument and insert it into the hole on the voting device to the right of each number that matches what you have marked on the chart.
- 3. After you have finished punching your official ballot, remove it from the voting device.

IF YOU WISH TO VERIFY YOUR VOTE:

- 1. Check each number that you marked on your Sample Official Ballot chart against the numbers punched on your official ballot to insure that you punched ail the same numbers for candidates and measures.
- 2. If any number is mispunched, ask a Precinct Official for help before you turn in your official ballot for deposit in the ballot box.

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS

PUNCH OUT BALLOT CARD ONLY WITH PUNCHING DEVICE ATTACHED TO VOTE RECORDER NEVER WITH PEN OR PENCIL.

To vote for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot, punch the ballot card at the point of the arrow opposite the number which corresponds to that candidate. Where two or more candidates for the same office are to be elected, punch the ballot card at the point of the arrow opposite the number which corresponds to those candidates. The number of punches should not exceed the number of candidates to be elected.

To vote for a qualified write-in candidate, write the name of the office and the candidate's name on the lines provided on the ballot card. Check with your precinct board for a list of qualified write-in candidates for this election.

All distinguished marks or erasures are forbidden and make the ballot void.

If you wrongly punch, tear, or deface the ballot card, return the ballot card to the precinct board member and obtain another.

INFORMATION FOR VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES

The staff at Voter Registration and Elections has attempted to locate and use polling places that are accessible to persons with limited mobility. A notation appearing on the label of your Sample Official Ballot indicates whether or not your polling place is accessible to voters with disabilities.

If your Sample Official Ballot label has a "NO" under the wheelchair symbol, your polling place does not meet State Guidelines for accessibility to voters with disabilities.

Call for more information about an inaccessible polling place. If you have limited mobility but are not in a wheelchair, your polling place may be accessible to you. Call (916) 875-6100 for specific information regarding limits to accessibility.

If your polling place is not accessible, there are other ways you can cast your ballot:

- 1. You may vote by absentee ballot. See the last page in this Sample Official Ballot for information concerning absentee voting. See the back cover for an application for an absentee voter ballot.
- 2. You may appear outside your assigned polling place, at the nearest place accessible to you (hallway, parking lot, automobile), and request that a official ballot be brought to you. After you have voted your official ballot, the Precinct Official will return it to the polling place and deposit it in the ballot box.

ABSENTEE VOTER INFORMATION

To qualify for an absentee voter ballot, you must:

- · Be a registered voter in Sacramento County, and
- Live in the district holding the election.

Beginning February 1, 1999, through February 23, 1999, you may come to the office to obtain an absentee ballot or you can complete and mail the application on the back cover of this pamphlet. You can also send a letter requesting an absentee ballot for this election which contains the following information, your name, your residence address, where you want the ballot mailed (if different), your signature, and a daytime phone number. To have a ballot mailed to you, the election office must receive your request no later than 5:00 p.m. on February 23, 1999.

To obtain an absentee ballot from February 24, 1999, through election day March 2, 1999, each voter must come in person to our office. If you are unable to do this, call (916) 875-6463 for instructions on how to authorize someone else to pick up your ballot for you. Absentee ballots issued between February 24, 1999 and March 2, 1999, cannot be returned through the mail.

VOTED ABSENTEE BALLOTS MUST BE RECEIVED IN THE REGISTRAR OF VOTERS' OFFICE OR AT ANY POLLING PLACE IN SACRAMENTO COUNTY NO LATER THAN 8:00 P.M. ON ELECTION DAY.

Registration for this election closed **February 1, 1999**. If you moved after this date, you can return to your old polling place for this election. A new registration form must be filled out to correct your address for future elections. If you moved before the registration close and did not re-register, under provisions of the National Voter Registration Act, you can vote on election day **IF**:

- You are currently registered to vote in Sacramento County,
- Both your old and new residence addresses are in Sacramento County,
- · For District elections, your new address must be in the District.

You will be voting at your new polling place after showing proof of your new residence address. A new registration form must be filled out to correct your address for future elections. If you need more information and/or the address of your new polling place, call (916) 875-6377.

To receive an absentee ballot if you moved before **February 1, 1999**, and did not re-register, you need to come to our office. Call (916) 875-6463 for details.

PERMANENT ABSENTEE VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

Any voter who has lost, or has lost the use of, one or more limbs; has lost or has lost the use of, both hands; is unable to move about without the aid of an assistant device (e.g., canes, crutches, walker, wheelchair); is suffering from lung disease, blindness, or cardiovascular disease; has a significant limitation in the use of the lower extremities; or is suffering from a diagnosed disease or disorder which substantially impairs or interferes with the person's mobility, may apply for permanent absentee voter status. This status also includes a relative related by blood or marriage who lives with the voter and has primary responsibility for their care (Elections Code Section 3201). Call (916) 875-6463 for information.

Once you have claimed permanent absentee voter status, you need not apply again unless you change your residence or mailing address, your political party, or your name.

If the voter fails to return his/her official ballot for any statewide direct primary or general election, the voter's name will be deleted from the permanent list and he/she must reapply (Elections Code Section 3206).
