FLAGLER COLLEGE

In March, 1999, David Kazmierski, a visiting instructor for the Graphics Design II class with Flagler College, invited Penny Halyburton, Supervisor of Elections for St. Johns County, to explain the FSASE Get Out The Vote Committee statewide poster contest to his students. Ms. Halyburton explained that the committee was seeking election-related logos and slogans which would be easily recognized by state residents as a reminder to vote in the 2000 elections. The plan was outlined for using the logos and slogans on billboards, bumper stickers and other election materials.

The students expressed a great deal of interest in the project and were anxious to get started. The GOTV Committee reviewed all the posters submitted from throughout the state and made their final selection...thus this 2000 election calendar. As you look through the calendar, we hope you will sense the pride and confidence in these young people and know that our future is in their very capable hands.

Flagler College is a four (4) year liberal arts school located in historical St. Augustine. The college is located in the former Hotel Ponce De Leon which has been described as a masterpiece in Spanish renaissance architecture. Henry Flagler built the Ponce De Leon Hotel in the late 1880's. The former ballroom, now the college dining room, features murals by George Maynard, stained glass windows by Louis Comfort Tiffany and gold leaf in the ceiling. Mr. Flagler is also credited with building the Florida East Coast Railroad and The Breakers Hotel in West Palm Beach.

VOTER INFORMATION

Please take a few minutes to read the following about voting in Florida. It should answer your questions about voter registration, election dates, and the availability of absentee ballots. If you would like any additional information, please call your Supervisor of Elections office. The addresses and telephone numbers are listed elsewhere in this calendar. We encourage you to participate in the process of deciding issues and electing our federal, state and local officials.

ELECTION DATES

A General Election is held in November of every even-numbered year. Primary elections, which precede each November General Election, are normally scheduled during September and October. Additionally, a Presidential Preference Primary is scheduled in March of Presidential election years. Special elections may be called at any time during the year.

VOTER REGISTRATION BOOK-CLOSING DATES

To vote in an election, you must be registered in the county where you live by the book-closing date, which is normally the 29th day before each election. You may apply for voter registration by submitting a Florida Voter Registration Application Form to your Supervisor of Elections. The forms are available at your Supervisor of Elections office, libraries, many post offices, banks and government offices.

PARTY AFFILIATION

To vote in a Democratic or Republican Primary Election, you must be registered in that party. However, a recently-approved amendment to the Florida Constitution states in part that if all candidates for an office have the same party affiliation and the winner will have no opposition in the General Election, all qualified voters, regardless of party affiliation, may vote in the primary election for that office. Party changes must be made by the end of the 29th day before the First Primary. Party changes requested after the books close for the First Primary do not become effective until after the Second Primary.

RESIDENCE ADDRESS

If you move within a county after you have registered to vote, please notify your Supervisor of Elections in writing as soon as possible. If you move to another Florida county and wish to be eligible to vote, you must register to vote in that county before the books close. Federal and State Laws require you to vote in your precinct of residence.

VOTER REGISTRATION CHANGES

Changes to your voter registration record must be submitted in writing and signed by you, the voter. You may send a letter or submit a completed Florida Voter Registration Application Form to your Supervisor of Elections office.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Call your Supervisor of Elections office to ask about an absentee ballot as soon as you know that you will be unable to go to the polls on Election Day. When requesting an absentee ballot, whether by phone or by letter, you must provide the last four digits of your Social Security Number, your name, residence address, date of birth, and voter identification number. Your request for an absentee ballot may be denied if you do not provide the required information. Specify the election(s) for which you wish to receive an absentee ballot and provide a mailing address. Check with your elections office if you need more information.





POLL WORKERS

Poll Workers are needed for every election. If you would like to become a Poll Worker, please call your Supervisor of Elections office.

HELPFUL HINTS

- ☆ Make sure all information on your voter identification card is correct.
- ☆ If you do not know the location of your polling place, call your Supervisor of Elections office for directions BEFORE Election Day.
- ☆ Sign your voter identification card; take it and your Florida Driver's License (or another form of picture identification showing your signature) to the polls.
- ☆ On Election Day the polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and are normally less busy during mid-morning and mid-afternoon.
