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
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

VOTER REGISTRATION QUALIFICATIONS

WHO IS QUALIFIED TO REGISTER TO VOTE?

Pursuant to the *Constitution of the State of Hawaii*, Article II, Section 1, a voter registration applicant must meet the following qualifications:

1. A citizen of the United States

Individuals from Guam, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands and the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands are considered U.S. citizens. Individuals from American Samoa are considered U.S. nationals (unless they are natural born or naturalized U.S. citizens).

A resident of the State of Hawaii

For voter registration and election purposes, a resident must maintain a residence address in the State of Hawaii and intend to make Hawaii their permanent residence.

3. At least eighteen years of age by the next election

Pre-Registration

Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) §11-12 allows an individual who is otherwise qualified to register and is at least sixteen years of age, to pre-register upon satisfactory proof of age and be automatically registered upon reaching age eighteen.

OHA ELECTION ELIGIBILITY

Qualified registrants for the regular elections who are of Hawaiian ancestry may register to vote in the Office of Hawaii Affairs (OHA) election. HRS §11-1 states that Hawaiian is:

"...any descendant of aboriginal peoples inhabiting the Hawaiian islands which exercised sovereignty and subsisted in the Hawaiian islands in 1778, and which peoples thereafter have continued to reside in Hawaii."

CLASS C FELONY

Pursuant to HRS §19-3.5, a person knowingly providing false information may be guilty of a Class C felony, punishable by up to five (5) years imprisonment and \$10,000 fine.

FACT SHEET

RULES TO DETERMINE RESIDENCY

The following are the rules that determine one's residency during an election, according to the Hawaii Revised Statutes §11-13:

- 1) The residence of a person is that place in which that person's habitation is fixed, and to which, whenever the person is absent, the person has the intention to return;
- 2) A person does not gain residence in any precinct into which the person comes without the present intention of establishing the person's permanent dwelling place within such precinct;
- If a person resides with the person's family in one place, and does business in another, the former is the person's place of residence; but any person having a family, who establishes the person's dwelling place other than with the person's family, with the intention of remaining there shall be considered a resident where the person has established such dwelling;
- 4) The mere intention to acquire a new residence without physical presence at such place, does not establish residency, neither does mere physical presence without the concurrent present intention to establish such place as the person's residence;
- 5) A person does not gain or lose a residence solely by reason of the person's presence or absence while employed in the service of the United States or of this State, or while a student of an institution of learning, or while kept in an institution or asylum, or while confined in a prison;
- 6) No member of the armed forces of the United States, the member's spouse or the member's dependent is a resident of this State solely by reason of being stationed in the State;
- 7) A person loses the person's residence in this State if the person votes in an election held in another state by absentee ballot or in person.

VOTER REGISTRATION NOTICE Address Confirmation System

WHAT IS THE VOTER REGISTRATION NOTICE

The Voter Registration Notice is a postcard sent by the City/County Clerk to all voters. The Notice:

- 1. Informs voters of their voting precinct and polling place during an election.
- 2. Confirms that voters are properly registered to vote in the district and precinct where they live.

WHO GETS THE VOTER REGISTRATION NOTICE?

A Voter Registration Notice is sent to all registered voters at the voter's residence address each election year.

A Voter Registration Notice is also sent after each reapportionment and redistricting.

HOW DOES THE ADDRESS CONFIRMATION SYSTEM WORK?

If a voter receives the Voter Registration Notice and the address on the notice corresponds to the voter's current address, s/he is properly registered and will be able to vote without undue delays on election day.

If the person does not receive the notice, the notice is returned to the Clerk by the U.S. Postal Service. The voter is "flagged" as a person with a "QUESTIONABLE ADDRESS."

On election day, an individual "flagged" is required to complete a Registration Affidavit form (RAF) before voting is allowed. This process is time consuming and may result in redirecting a voter to his/her proper polling place.

HOW TO VOTE

WHERE TO VOTE

Registered voters in the State of Hawaii will receive a Voter Registration Notice prior to the election. The Notice lists which election(s) the voter is eligible to vote in, their district/precinct number, and their polling place location. Voter's should go to the polling place listed on their postcard.

BRING PROPER IDENTIFICATION

Bring a picture ID card with your signature with you to your polling place. The precinct official will use your ID to verify your identity. Your Voter Registration Notice is **not** an acceptable form of identification.

AT THE POLLING PLACE

- 1. List of Registered Voters: Check the List of Registered Voter to see if your name is on the list of voters for that precinct. If your name is there, proceed to the next station. If not, see a Voter Assistance Official.
- 2. Demonstration Station: Go to the Information and Voting Device Demonstration Station located outside of the polling place. A precinct official will:
 - a. Verify that you are at the correct polling place;
 - b. Verify that you are properly registered; and
 - c. Instruct you on the proper voting procedures.

- 3. Poll Book Station: Proceed to the Poll Book Station. Names are arranged in the poll book alphabetically by last name. Look for the poll book station with the first letter of your last name. You will be asked to:
 - a. Verify your identify with a picture ID card (such as your driver's license):
 - b. Verify the information in the poll book; and
 - Sign the poll book.
- 4. Ballot Issuing Station: The official at the Ballot Issuing Station will issue your ballots and a ballot holder. The amount of ballots you receive and procedures for voting will differ according to the election:

PRIMARY ELECTION:

The Hawaii State Constitution, Article II, Section 4, provides:

"Secrecy of voting shall be preserved; provided that no person shall be required to declare a party preference or nonpartisanship as a condition of voting in any primary or special primary election. Secrecy of voting and choice of political party affiliation or nonpartisanship shall be preserved."

Ballot Selection & Discard Box Station:

After you receive you ballot packet at the Ballot Issuing Station, proceed to the Ballot Selection & Discard Box Station. You will:

- a. Enter the Ballot Selection Booth.
- b. Tear the ballot packet open.
- c. Select a partisan or nonpartisan (white) and a "special" (pink) ballot and place them into the ballot holder.
- d. Place the unselected ballots back into the ballot packet.
- e. Return the ballot packet containing the unselected ballots to the Discard Box Official.

GENERAL ELECTION:

You will receive a set of ballot cards for all contests in the General Election. Additional ballots may include:

- a. Board of Education
- b. Charter Amendment Questions
- c. Constitutional Amendment Questions

Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA)

If you are an OHA registered voter, you will receive an OHA ballot in addition to the regular election ballots.

NOTE: You must be of Hawaiian ancestry to participate in the OHA election.

- 5. Voting Booth: In the Voting Booth you will find a voting device.
 - a. Place the ballot under the plastic cover with the end marked "TOP" facing up.

NOTE: The ballot must be FLAT and SNUG in the voting device or the device will not function properly.

- b. Move the handle so the red arrow points to your selection.
- c. Press down on the handle to punch a hole in the ballot.
- d. Continue doing the same for all the contests and questions. Be sue to check both sides of the ballot for contests, as appropriate.

NOTE: If you make a mistake, see a precinct official for assistance.

- e. When you have completed voting, return the handle to the top of the voting device and remove your ballot.
- f. Place the ballots into the ballot holder, with the ballot stubs at the top, and exit the booth.
- **6. Ballot Box Station:** Proceed to the Ballot Box Station. Hand your ballot holder to the precinct official. The precinct Official will deposit your ballots

into the ballot box and return the ballot stubs to you. Remember to keep your ballot stubs as your proof of voting.

To save yourself time on election day, here are a few tips:

TIP 1:

To avoid long lines at the polls, vote during non-peak hours:

In the morning, between 9:30 am and 11:00 am. In the afternoon, between 1:00 pm and 4:00 pm.

TIP 2:

To make voting easier and faster, familiarize yourself with the various election contests, candidates, and charter and constitutional questions on the ballot. **Know your choices before you go into the voting booth!**

TIP 3:

Be sure you're at the right polling place. Check the list of registered voters posted outside of the polling place.

TIP 4:

Be sure that you are properly registered. Be sure that you meet the registration qualifications:

- a. U.S. citizen
- b. Legal resident of the State
- c. 18 years of age.

TIP 5:

To vote in the OHA election, you must meet the voter registration qualifications and be of Hawaiian ancestry. If you wish to participate in the OHA election, be sure that you are an OHA registered voter.

SECRECY OF VOTING AND PARTY PREFERENCE

The Hawaii State Constitution provides:

"Secrecy of voting shall be preserved; provided that no person shall be required to declare a party preference or nonpartisanship as a condition of voting in any primary or special primary election. Secrecy of voting and choice of political party affiliation or nonpartisanship shall be preserved."

Hawaii State Constitution
 Article II, Section 4

The following steps are taken to assure the secrecy of voting and party preference in the State of Hawaii.

SECRECY OF PARTY OR NONPARTISAN PREFERENCE

In the State of Hawaii voters are not required to declare their party or nonpartisan preference in order to register or vote.

Hawaii uses the single party primary system to nominate candidates who will run in the general election. In this system, candidates for each political party and nonpartisan candidates are placed on separate ballot cards. This set of party ballots and nonpartisan ballots are sealed in a packet. Each voter is issued a single ballot packet (containing a set of ballots). The voter selects a ballot for one and only one party (or nonpartisan ballot) and votes on only that ballot (there is no cross-party or multi-party voting permitted). The selection is made in the privacy of a "Ballot Selection Booth." All ballots not selected by the voter are deposited in a sealed "Discard Box." This process ensures that only the voter knows his/her party or nonpartisan preference.

In the general election, candidates for all parties are listed on a single ballot. Voters may vote for any candidate they wish regardless of party affiliation, but are limited to vote for only the number of candidates as there are seats available in that contest. Again, secrecy of party or nonpartisan preference is preserved.

SECRECY OF VOTING

Voting is a primary right/responsibility of citizenship. In the State of Hawaii, the secrecy of voting is constitutionally assured.

The secrecy of voting is provided for in the following manner:

- Each voter selects a party or nonpartisan ballot in private (primary only); in the general voters may vote for a candidate regardless of partisanship/nonpartisanship.
- Each voter votes in private.
- 3. No voter is required to tell anyone how he/she voted.

INVENTORY NUMBERS, ID NUMBERS, AND CODES

Primary Election

In the primary election, a voter will find the following inventory numbers, ID numbers, and codes on their ballots:

- 1. Consecutive Serial Number: This printed number serves as an inventory of ballots produced and received.
- Consecutive Serial Number Packet: This printed number serves as an inventory of ballot packets produced and received. It is the number recorded in the pollbook when a voter votes. This number is used as part of the audit reconciliation process to make certain that the number of people voting is equal to the number of ballots cast.
- 3. Plate Code: This is a printed three digit code which tells the printer which printing plate was used to print that particular ballot face. This printed number is used in the ballot proofing process.
- 4. Ballot Footprint (Ballot Type-District/Precinct Number): The first three digits of this number indicate which unique set of election contests appear on the ballot; the second four digits indicate which district/precinct the ballot is used in. This printed number is used as part of the proofing process.
- 5. Ballot Type Code: This is a three digit punched code on the bottom of the card. It indicates which unique set of election contests appear on the ballot. It is used for both proofing and ballot counting purposes.

6. Ballot Set ID Number: This is a six digit punched code on the bottom of the card. The purpose of the code is to prevent cross-party (multi-party) voting.

The consecutive serial number on the packet does not in any way match any serial number or code on the ballots. A specific ballot cannot, therefore be traced to a specific voter. Not only the secrecy of voting is honored, but the secrecy of the vote is also assured.

General Election

In a general election, a voter will find the following serial numbers and codes on his/her ballot:

- 1. Consecutive Serial Number: The same printed number appears on the "stub" and on the "stub receipt." This number is recorded in the poll book and is used as part of an audit reconciliation process. The "stub receipt" is given to the voter as proof of voting.
- 2. Plate Code: This is a printed three digit code which tells the printer which printing plate was used to print a particular ballot face. This printed number is used in the ballot proofing process.
- 3. Ballot Footprint (Ballot Type-District/Precinct Number): The first three digits of this number indicate which unique set of election contests appear on the ballot; the second four digits indicate which district/precinct the ballot is used in. This printed number is used as part of the proofing process as well as the ballot counting process.
- 4. Ballot Type Code: This is a three digit punched number which indicates what unique set of election contests appears on this ballot. The code is used for proofing and ballot counting purposes.

After voting, the stub receipt is removed by an election officer and given to the voter. Once the stub receipt is removed, the ballot cannot be traced to a specific voter. Again, not only is the secrecy of voting honored, but the secrecy of vote is also assured.





DIAGRAM OF A PRIMARY BLECTION PRECINCT BALLOT





DIAGRAM OF A GENERAL ELECTION PRECINCT BALLOT

ABSENTEE VOTING

WHO MAY VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT?

Any person who is registered to vote in the State of Hawaii may vote by absentee ballot.

HOW DO I VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT?

In Person

Vote by absentee ballot in person at an Absentee Polling Place established by your Office of the City/County Clerk. The Absentee Polling Place will be open no later than 18 days before the Primary and General Elections.

By Mail

Vote by absentee ballot by mail by completing an "Application for Absentee Voter Ballot".

Hawaii Revised Statutes §15-4 provides that:

"...Any mailed requests for an absentee ballot shall be mailed by the person directly to the clerk."

Submit your completed application directly to the Office of your City/County Clerk no earlier than 60 days and not later than 7 days before the election.

The application form will require the following information of each applicant:

- Name under which you are registered to vote;
- Residence address as registered;
- Birthdate;
- Social Security Number:
- Home and/or business telephone number;

FEDERAL WRITE-IN ABSENTEE BALLOT

The Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB) is a blank ballot on which the voter may write-in either the name of the candidate, or the name of the political party for which he or she wishes to vote for. The FWAB is used by overseas voters, both military and civilian for Federal offices/contests in the General Election.

An overseas citizen applying for the FWAB must meet the following three requirements:

1) The voter must meet all the regular requirements for voting in his or her state of legal residence.

This means that the voter must be registered or be exempt from registration under state law, comply with all state laws regarding absentee voting, and return the FWAB before the normal state deadling for receiving absentee ballots.

2) The voter must have requested a regular state absentee ballot as directed by his or her state's procedures, so that the request was received by the local election official at least thirty (30) days before an election.

An FWAB request is deemed valid only when a state absentee ballot has been requested in the timely manner mentioned above.

3) The voter must be casting his or her absentee ballot from outside the United States.

A citizen voting via an FWAB must have a mailing address outside of the U.S. or have an active APO/FPO address.

Failure to meet to the above three requirements will invalidate the vote cast by the FWAB.

UNIFORMED AND OVERSEAS CITIZENS

The purpose of the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) is to permit absent uniformed services and overseas citizens to use absentee procedures to vote by absentee ballot in primary, general, and special elections for Federal offices; and to permit these individuals to use a Federal write-in absentee ballot (FWAB) in the General Election for Federal offices.

Citizens residing overseas are those persons who reside anywhere except the states of the U.S., the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the Virgin Islands, and American Samoa.

An absent uniformed services citizen is:

- A member of a uniformed service on active duty who is absent from the place of residence where the member is otherwise qualified to vote;
- A member of the merchant marine who, by reason of service in the merchant marine, is absent from the place of residence where the member is otherwise qualified to vote; or
- A spouse or dependent of an active duty uniformed services citizen who is absent.

Overseas citizens means:

- An absent uniformed services citizen who, by reason of active duty or service is absent from the United States on the day of the election; or
- A person who resides outside the United States and is qualified to vote in the last place in which the person was domiciled before leaving the United States
- A person who resides outside the U.S. and (but for such residency) would be qualified to vote in the last place in which the person was domiciled before leaving the U.S.

ABSENTEE VOTING

Any unregistered person unable to register in person may register by mail. To register to vote, the applicant must mail a completed Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) to his/her County Clerk not earlier than 60 days before the election nor later than 30 days before an election. An absentee ballot may be requested at the same time.

Applying for and Voting by Absentee Ballot

Currently registered persons may request an absentee ballot by mailing a completed FPCA to his/her County Clerk not earlier than 60 days before the election nor later than seven (7) days before an election.

Absentee ballots are mailed 35 days before an election. The clerk must receive voted ballots by the close of polls on election day. For further information, contact:

WHEN A PERSON BECOMES A CANDIDATE

Under Hawaii state law, there are two separate and distinct requirements that determine when a person becomes a candidate. The first requirement relates to registering with the Campaign Spending Commission. The second requirement relates to gaining access to Hawaii's ballots.

REGISTRATION WITH CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION

State law requires each candidate to register and to file a financial report with the Campaign Spending Commission on forms provided by the Commission. For purposes of registering with the Campaign Spending Commission, an individual is a candidate for an office if the individual:

- files nomination papers;
- receives contributions over \$100 or makes any expenditures;
- gives consent to another person to receive contributions or make expenditures; or
- is certified to be a candidate by the elections office.

Candidates are required to register with the Campaign Spending Commission by filing an Organizational Report within ten days from the date the candidate's committee receives contributions totaling more than \$100 or makes any expenditure. Candidates or their committees must also file reports of campaign contributions (receipts) and expenditures.

BALLOT ACCESS FOR CANDIDATES

State law requires candidates to file nomination papers to gain access to the State of Hawaii's ballots. For ballot access purposes, a person becomes a candidate when the person files nomination papers and fulfills the requirements to be a candidate.

Candidate requirements include:

- Signature of registered voters: When nomination papers are filed, the nomination paper must be signed by a specified number of properly registered voters who are qualified to vote for the candidate in the upcoming election. The number of signatures varies with the office sought and ranges from 15 to 25.
- Certification by candidates: Candidates must certify that they will qualify for the office sought when they file their nomination papers.
- Member of Political Party: Partisan candidates must certify that they
 are a member of the political party when they file their nomination
 papers.
- Oath of loyalty/affirmation: Candidates are required to take and subscribe to a prescribed written oath of loyalty or affirmation statement before a notary public or a public officer authorized by law to administer oaths. The Oath/Affirmation must be completed when nomination papers are filed.
- Resignation from office: Elected state or county public officials must resign from the office currently held before being eligible as a candidate for another state or county elective office. This applies only if the term of the office presently held is not normally scheduled for election in the same year as the office sought. The candidate must resign from office before filing his/her nomination papers.
- <u>Filing fee:</u> The filing fee, which varies with the office sought and ranges from \$25 to \$750, must be paid by cash, money order, or certified/cashier's check at the time that nomination papers are filed.

NONPARTISAN CANDIDATES QUALIFICATION FOR THE GENERAL ELECTION

Individuals not affiliated with any qualified political party in Hawaii may run as nonpartisan candidates. Nonpartisan candidates must file nomination papers and pay a filing fee to qualify for the office and will appear on a separate nonpartisan ballot in the Primary Election.

To qualify for the General Election, nonpartisan candidates must meet one of the following qualifications:

- Method 1: receive at least ten percent (10%) of the total votes cast for the office for which the person is a candidate at the Primary Election; OR
- Method 2: receive a vote equal to the lowest vote received by the partisan candidate who was nominated in the Primary Election for the office.

NOTE: If more nonpartisan candidates qualify to run in the General Election than there are offices (seats) available, there shall be certified as candidates those receiving the highest number of votes, but not more candidates than there are offices (seats) to be elected [HRS §12-41(b)].

Requirement: The nonpartisan candidate must receive at least ten percent (10%) of the total number of

Calculation: 1,925 votes times 10% = 192.5 or 193 votes required.

Result: Neither nonpartisan candidate qualifies under this method.

Method 2:

Requirement: The nonpartisan candidate must receive a vote equal to or greater than the lowest vote

received by the partisan candidate who was nominated in the Primary Election for the office.

Calculation: The Green Party candidate received the least number of votes of all partisan candidates who

won their primaries and were nominated for the General Election. Therefore, the nonpartisan candidate must match or exceed the number of votes received by the Green Party candidate to

qualify for the General Election.

Green Candidate: 50 votes
Nonpartisan Candidate A: 50 votes
Nonpartisan Candidate B: 75 votes

Result: Although both nonpartisan candidates matched the number of votes received by the Green

Party candidate, only nonpartisan candidate B qualifies under this method. Because there is only one seat available for this Senatorial race, the nonpartisan candidate receiving the highest

number of votes qualifies to advance to the General Election. Thus, only nonpartisan

candidate B will be placed on the General Election ballot.

CALCULATING A MAJORITY FOR THE CITY & COUNTY OF HONOLULU SPECIAL ELECTIONS

For the City and County Honolulu Special Elections, a candidate must receive a majority of votes cast for the office to be elected. If no candidate receives a majority, a second special election is held in conjunction with the general election between the two candidates receiving the most votes. The candidate with the highest number of votes at this second special election is deemed elected.

"Blank votes" and "over votes" are not included in the calculation of a majority for the City Special Elections. To calculate a majority, add the votes for all of the candidates in the respective contest, divide that sum by two, and add one.

The following is an example of this calculation.

Results of the First Special Election:

 Candidate A 300

 Candidate B 100

 Candidate C 150

 Blank Votes 101

 Over Votes 159

 Total (sum) 810

Step 1: Add the votes cast for each candidate.

 Candidate A 300

 Candidate B 100

 Candidate C 150

 Total (sum) 550

Step 2: Divide the sum of the votes cast by two.

 $550 \div 2 = 275$

Step 3: Add one to the result from Step 2.

275 + 1 = 276 votes required to win by majority

Step 4: Candidate A wins the first Special Election. The second Special Election will not be held.

CAUTION: The percentage figures appearing in the Teamwork printout reflect "blank votes" and "over votes."

THE PETITION PROCESS TO PLACE THE NAMES OF CANDIDATES FOR PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT ON THE STATE OF HAWAII GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT

Refer to §11-113 and Chapter 14 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) for information dealing with presidential elections and candidates.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The names of the candidates for president and vice president shall be used on the ballot in place of the names of the presidential electors. The votes cast for president and vice president of each political party shall be counted for the presidential electors and alternates nominated by each political party. Hawaii is entitled to four presidential electors in the 1996 election. (HRS §§11-113 and 14-23 and U.S. Constitution, Article II, Section 1)

NOTARIZED STATEMENT OF INTENT (HRS §11-113)

Prior to receiving the petition forms, the group/party shall submit to the chief election officer a notarized statement from each candidate of their intent to be a candidate for president and vice president on the general election ballot in the State of Hawaii.

PETITION FOR QUALIFICATION (HRS §11-113)

Upon receipt of the notarized statement of intent, the chief election officer shall issue the group/party the petition forms.

1. The petition shall be filed with the chief election officer not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 60th day prior to the general election. In 1996, the deadline to file the petition is Friday, September 6, 1996.

2. The petition shall:

- a. be upon a form prescribed and provided by the chief election officer and shall contain the names of both candidates;
- b. contain a statement that the persons signing intend to support those candidates;
- c. contain the address of each signatory and the date signed; and
- d. contain the signatures of currently registered voters constituting not less than one per cent (1%) of the votes cast in the State at the last presidential election (382,882 voted in the 1992 presidential election = 3,829 signatures required).
- 3. The applicant, and the candidates named, shall be notified in writing of the applicant's or candidate's eligibility or disqualification for placement on the ballot not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 10th business day after filing. The chief election officer may extend the notification period up to an additional five business days if the applicants and candidates are notified.
- 4. If the applicant, or any other party, individual, or group with a candidate on the presidential ballot, objects to the finding of eligibility or disqualification the person may, not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 5th day after the finding, file a request in writing with the chief election officer for a hearing on the question. A hearing shall be called not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 10th day after receipt of request and shall be conducted in accord with Chapter 91. A decision shall be issued not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 5th day after the conclusion of the hearing.

WITHDRAWAL OF SIGNATURES FROM THE PETITION (HRS §11-6)

A voter who signs a petition and seeks to withdraw his/her signature from the petition may do so if the petition has not yet been filed with the chief election officer.

- A voter who seeks to withdraw the voter's signature from a petition must submit a notice in writing to the chief election officer any time before the filing of the petition. The notice shall include the voter's:
 - a. name;
 - b. social security number;

- c. residence address;
- d. date of birth; and
- e. signature with the name under which the voter is registered to vote.
- 2. Upon receipt of that notice containing the information required by HRS §11-6, the chief election officer shall notify the group or individual to whom the petition was issued and the signature of the individual shall not be counted.

SWORN APPLICATION (HRS §11-113)

- 1. The sworn application shall be filed not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 60th day prior to the general election with the chief election officer in the Office of Elections. In 1996, the deadline to file the sworn application is Friday, September 6, 1996.
- 2. The sworn application shall include:
 - a. the names and addresses of each of the two candidates;
 - b. a statement that each candidate is legally qualified to serve under the provisions of the United States Constitution; and
 - c. a statement that candidates are duly chosen candidates of both the state and national party, giving time, place, and manner of selection (where applicable).

PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS AND ALTERNATES (HRS Chapter 14)

- 1. The party/group shall hold a state party or group convention to nominate as candidates four electors, and a first and second alternate for each elector, of president and vice president as the State is entitled. The electors shall be registered voters of the State. (HRS §14-21)
- 2. The names and addresses of the nominees for presidential elector and alternates shall be certified by the chairman and secretary of the convention and submitted to the chief election officer not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 60th day prior to the general election. In 1996, the deadline will be Friday, September 6, 1996. (HRS §14-21)

- 3. The chief election officer shall certify to the governor the names of the elected presidential electors and alternates receiving the highest number of votes as elected as presidential electors and alternates not later than 4:30 p.m. on the last day in the month of the election. (HRS §14-24)
- 4. The presidential electors shall assemble at the State Capitol on the first Monday after the second Wednesday in December next following their election, at two o'clock in the afternoon. In 1996, the electors shall assemble on December 16, 1996. (HRS §14-26)

ELECTION DATES

The Primary Election will be held on Saturday, September 21, 1996.

The General election will be held on Tuesday, November 5, 1996.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CORRECTLY COMPLETING THE PETITION FORM

- 1. The petition can only be verified on the basis of the information contained on it.
- 2. Use black ink for all signatures.
- 3. The signature of the voter should match the signature on his/her most recent voter registration affidavit. This same signature will be needed for any necessary signature validity checks.
- 4. The name of the voter must be printed in the space provided.
- 5. The residence address of the voter where he/she is registered to vote must be recorded, not any address to which the voter has moved subsequent to registering and has failed to make the change of registration as required by law. Mailing addresses are not acceptable.
- 6. The date on which the signature was recorded must be indicated.
- 7. Both the voter's social security number and date of birth will be needed to distinguish among people having identical names and/or addresses.

8. Pursuant to law, any registered voter who fails to vote at all in two consecutive election years is removed from the Official List of Registered Electors. (HRS §11-17)

- §11-113 Presidential ballots. (a) In presidential elections, the names of the candidates for president and vice president shall be used on the ballot in lieu of the names of the presidential electors, and the votes cast for president and vice president of each political party shall be counted for the presidential electors and alternates nominated by each political party.
- (b) A "national party" as used in this section shall mean a party established and admitted to the ballot in at least one state other than Hawaii or one which is determined by the chief election officer to be making a bona fide effort to become a national party. If there is no national party or the national and state parties or factions in either the national or state party do not agree on the presidential and vice presidential candidates, the chief election officer may determine which candidates' names shall be placed on the ballot or may leave the candidates' names off the ballot completely.
- (c) All candidates for president and vice president of the United States shall be qualified for inclusion on the general election ballot under either of the following procedures:
 - (1) In the case of candidates of political parties which have been qualified to place candidates on the primary and general election ballots, the appropriate official of those parties shall file a sworn application with the chief election officer not later than 4:30 p.m. on the sixtieth day prior to the general election, which shall include:
 - (A) The name and address of each of the two candidates;
 - (B) A statement that each candidate is legally qualified to serve under the provisions of the United States Constitution:
 - (C) A statement that the candidates are the duly chosen candidates of both the state and the national party, giving the time, place, and manner of the selection.
 - (2) In the case of candidates of parties or groups not qualified to place candidates on the primary or general election ballots, the person desiring to place the names on the general election ballot shall file with the chief election officer not later than 4:30 p.m. on the sixtieth day prior to the general election:
 - (A) A sworn application which shall include the information required under paragraph (1)(A) and (B), and (C) where applicable;
 - (B) A petition which shall be upon the form prescribed and provided by the chief election officer containing the signatures of currently registered voters which constitute not less than one per cent of the votes cast in the State at the last presidential election. The petition shall contain the names of the candidates, a statement that the persons signing intend to support those candidates, the address of each signatory, the date of the signer's signature and other information as determined by the chief election officer.

Prior to being issued the petition form, the person desiring to place the names on the general election ballot shall submit a notarized statement from each candidate of that person's intent to be a candidate for President or Vice President of the United States on the general election ballot in the State of Hawaii. Such statements may be withdrawn by a prospective candidate for Vice President and an alternative candidate for Vice President be substituted anytime prior to the notification of qualification or disqualification provided in subsection (d). Any such substitutions shall be accompanied by a notice of substitution satisfying subparagraph (A), a statement of intent as required by this paragraph, and a letter by the candidate for President endorsing the substitute candidate for Vice President. Upon receipt of a notice of substitution and all other required documents, the substitute shall replace the original candidate for Vice President on the general election ballot. The petitions issued in the names of the original candidates will remain valid for the purposes of this section.

- (d) Each applicant and the candidates named, shall be notified in writing of the applicant's or candidate's eligibility or disqualification for placement on the ballot not later than 4:30 p.m. on the tenth business day after filing. The chief election officer may extend the notification period up to an additional five business days, if the applicants and candidates are provided with notice of the extension and the reasons therefore.
- (e) If the applicant, or any other party, individual, or group with a candidate on the presidential ballot, objects to the finding of eligibility or disqualification the person may, not later than 4:30 p.m. on the fifth day after the finding, file a request in writing with the chief election officer for a hearing on the question. A hearing shall be called not later than 4:30 p.m. on the tenth day after the receipt of the request and shall be conducted in accord with chapter 91. A decision shall be issued not later than 4:30 p.m. on the fifth day after the conclusion of the hearing. - §14-21 Nomination of presidential electors and alternates; certification; notification of nominees. In each year when electors of president and vice president of the United States are to be chosen, each of the political parties or parties or groups qualified under section 11-113 shall hold a state party or group convention pursuant to the constitution, bylaws, and rules of the party or group; and nominate as candidates for its party or group as many electors, and a first and second alternate for each elector, of president and vice president of the United States as the State is then entitled. The electors and alternates shall be registered voters of the State. The names and addresses of the nominees shall be certified by the chairman and secretary of the convention of the respective parties or groups and submitted to the chief election officer not later than 4:30 p.m. on the sixtieth day prior to the general election of the same year. The chief election officer upon receipt thereof, shall immediately notify each of the nominees for elector and alternate elector of the nomination. [L 1970, c 26, pt of §2; am L 1973, c 217, §4(b); am L 1981, c 100, §2(1)]
- §14-22 Contested nominations of presidential electors and alternates. If more than one certificate of choice and selection of presidential electors and alternate electors of the same political party or group is filed with the chief election officer, as chairman of the contested presidential electors' committee hereby constituted, the chief election officer shall notify the state comptroller and attorney general, who are the remaining members of the committee, of the date, time, and place of the hearing to be held for the purposes of making a determination of which set of electors and alternate electors were lawfully chosen and selected by the political party or group. Notice of the hearing shall be given to the chairman of the state central committee of each political party and the chairman of each party or group qualified under section 11-113, contestants for the positions of electors and alternate electors by written notice, and to all other interested parties by publication at least once in a newspaper of general circulation. A determination shall be made by the committee by majority vote not later than 4:30 p.m. on October 30 of the same year and the determination shall be final. Notice of the results shall be given to the nominees duly determined to have been chosen. The committee shall have all the powers enumerated in section 11-43. [L 1970, c 26, pt of §2; am L 1973, c 217, §4(c); am L 1981, c 100, §2(2)]
- §14-23 Time for election, number to be chosen. In each presidential election year there shall be elected at large, at the general election, by the voters of the State, as many electors and alternates of

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president and vice president of the United States as the State is then entitled to elect, in the manner provided under section 11-113. The electors and the alternates must be registered voters of the State. The election shall be conducted and the results thereof determined in conformity with the laws governing general elections except as otherwise provided. [L 1970, c 26, pt of §2; am L 1977, c 189, §3]

\$14-24 Certificate of election, notice of meeting. Not later than 4:30 p.m. on the last day in the month of the election, or as soon as the returns have been received from all counties in the State, if received before that time, the chief election officer shall certify to the governor the names of the presidential electors and alternates of the same political party or group as the candidates for president and vice president receiving the highest number of votes as elected as presidential electors and alternates. Thereupon the governor shall in accordance with the laws of the United States, communicate by registered mail under the seal of the State of Hawaii to the administrator of general services of the United States, the certificates of persons elected as presidential electors, setting forth the names of the electors and the total number of votes cast for each elector. The chief election officer shall thereupon, together with a notice of the time and place of the meeting of the electors, cause to issue and transmit to each elector and alternate a certificate of election signed by the governor in substantially the following form:

- §14-25 Duties of the governor. On or before the day of the meeting of the electors the governor shall deliver to the electors a list of the names of electors, and the governor shall perform any other duties relating to the presidential electors which are required of the governor by laws of the United States. [L 1970, c 26, pt of §2; am imp L 1984, c 90, §1]
- §14-26 Assembly of electors at state capital; time. The electors chosen shall assemble at the state capital on the first Monday after the second Wednesday in December next following their election, at two o'clock in the afternoon. [L 1970, c 26, pt of §2]
- \$14-27 Filling vacancies of presidential electors. In case of the death or absence of any elector chosen, or if the number of electors is deficient for any other reason, the vacancy or vacancies shall be filled by the alternates in the order of their numerical designation for their respective electors causing the vacancy or vacancies, and in the event that vacancy or vacancies still exist, then the electors present shall select from the members of the same political party or group as many persons as will supply the deficiency. Certificates for the alternates or substitutes as presidential electors shall be issued by the governor. [L 1970, c 26, pt of §2; am L 1981, c 100, §2(4)]

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- §14-28 Convening and voting for president and vice president; party vote. The electors, when convened, if both candidates are alive, shall vote by ballot for that person for president and that person for vice president of the United States, who are, respectively, the candidates of the political party or group which they represent, one of whom, at least, is not an inhabitant of this State. [L 1970, c 26, pt of §2; am L 1981, c 100, §2(5)]
- \$14-29 Naming persons voted for in ballots, separate ballots. The electors shall name in their ballots the person voted for as president, and in separate ballots the person voted for as vice president. [L 1970, c 26, pt of §2]
- \$14-30 Lists of persons voted for and number of votes, certification, transmission to president of the senate. The electors shall separately list the persons voted for as president and as vice president, respectively, and the number of votes for each, which lists they shall sign, certify, seal, and transmit by mail, one copy to the seat of the government of the United States, directed to the president of the senate of the United States, and make such other disposition of the lists as required by law. [L 1970, c 26, pt of §2]
- \$14-31 Compensation and mileage of electors, amounts. Each presidential elector shall receive \$50 for the elector's services, plus the reasonable cost of transportation from the elector's voting residence in the State to the state capital and return. Their accounts shall be certified to by the chief election officer and audited by the state comptroller, and shall be payable out of the general fund. [L 1970, c 26, pt of \$2; am imp L 1984, c 90, \$1]

PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS STATE OF HAWAII 1996 GENERAL ELECTION

Refer to Chapter 14 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) for information dealing with presidential electors and elections.

GENERAL INFORMATION

In the State of Hawaii, the names of the candidates for president and vice president are used on the ballot in place of the names of the presidential electors. The votes cast for president and vice president of each political party, or group that has qualified by petition to place the names of their candidates on the ballot, shall be counted for the presidential electors and alternates nominated by their respective political party/group. Hawaii is entitled to four presidential electors in the 1996 election. (HRS Sections 11-113 and 14-23 and U.S. Constitution, Article II, Section 1)

SUBMISSION OF NAMES OF PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS AND ALTERNATES (HRS Chapter 14)

The party/group that is eligible to place the names of candidates for president and vice president on the General Election ballot shall hold a state party or group convention to nominate as candidates four presidential electors. The party/group shall also nominate as candidates a first and second alternate for each presidential elector. In total, the party/group shall nominate four presidential electors, four first alternate electors, and four second alternate electors. State law requires that the electors shall be registered voters of the State. (HRS Section 14-21)

The names and addresses of the nominees for presidential elector and alternates shall be certified by the chairman and secretary of the convention and submitted to the chief election officer not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 60th day prior to the general election. In 1996, the deadline will be Friday, September 6, 1996. (HRS Section 14-21)

ELECTION OF PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS (HRS Chapter 14)

The electors and alternates of the party/group that receives the most votes for president and vice president in the General Election shall be elected and shall attend the Electoral College to cast votes for president and vice president. All four of the electors shall be of the same party/group. In accordance with State law, the chief election officer shall certify to the governor the names of the elected presidential electors and alternates not later than 4:30 p.m. on the last day in the month of the election. (HRS Section 14-24)

CONVENING OF THE PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS

The presidential electors shall assemble at the State Capitol on the first Monday after the second Wednesday in December next following their election, at two o'clock in the afternoon. In 1996, the electors shall assemble on December 16, 1996 at the State Capitol. (HRS Section 14-26)

The electors, when convened, shall vote by ballot for that person for president and that person for vice president of the United States, who are, respectively, the candidates of the party or group which they represent. State law does not require that the electors cast their vote for the candidates that were listed on the General Election ballot. (HRS Section 14-28)

1996 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS FOR STATE OF HAWAII

The list of the presidential electors and alternates for 1996 will be available after the September 6, 1996 submission deadline.

ELECTIONEERING AND CAMPAIGNING

ELECTIONEERING

Hawaii Revised Statutes §11-132 provides:

"...(a) The precinct officials shall post in a conspicuous place, prior to the opening of the polls, a map designated an area of two hundred feet from the perimeter of the polling place and its appurtenances. Any person who remains or loiters within an area of two hundred feet from the perimeter of the polling place and its appurtenances for the purpose of campaigning shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. For the purposes of this section, a polling place and its appurtenances shall include:

- (1) The building in which the polling place is located;
- (2) Any parking lot adjacent to the building and routinely used for parking at that building;
- (3) The routes of access between the building and any parking lot; and
- (4) Any route of access between any public thoroughfare and the polling place to ensure an open and accessible ingress and egress to and from the polling place for voters...

"...(d) Within the appropriate boundary as established in subsection (a), and the building in which the polling place is located, the display or distribution of campaign posters, signs, or other campaign materials for the purpose of soliciting votes for or against any person or political party or position on a question is prohibited. Any voter who displays campaign material in the polling place shall remove or cover that material before entering the polling place..."

CAMPAIGNING

Pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes §19-6:

"...campaign activities shall include the following:

- A. Any distribution, circulation, carrying, holding, posting, or staking of campaign cards, pamphlets, posters, and other literature;
- B. The use of public address systems and other public communication media:

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- C. The use of motor caravans or parades; and
- D. The use of entertainment troupes or the free distribution of goods and services..."

Cars and other vehicles with political signs and stickers may remain within the two hundred foot perimeter only during the time their drivers or occupants are actually voting. Precinct officials who have cars with political bumper stickers must cover the stickers for the day.

Election day violations should be reported to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor Control Center at 453-8683.

NOTE: This fact sheet is merely a reference and should not be used as the authority on laws pertaining to electioneering and campaigning.

FACT SHEET Campaign Sign Regulations

FEDERAL REGULATIONS:

Department of Transportation's Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) policies and requirements, Subpart G-Outdoor Advertising Control:

23 CFR (Code of Federal Regulations), Chapter I (4-1-93 Edition), §750.704 (Statutory Requirements): Restricts signs adjacent to Interstate and Primary highways which are visible from the main-traveled way and within 660 feet of the edge of the right-of-way to the following:

- 1) Directional and official signs;
- Signs advertising the sale or lease of property upon which they are located:
- 3) Signs advertising activities conducted on the property on which they are located:
- 4) Signs which are zoned industrial or commercial under State law;
- 5) Signs which are unzoned industrial or commercial as determined by the State and the U.S. Secretary of Transportation; and
- 6) Landmark signs which have been lawfully in existence since October 22, 1965.

STATE REGULATIONS — Hawaii Revised Statutes

§264-72 Control of outdoor advertising. No person shall erect or maintain any outdoor advertising outside the right of way boundary and visible from the main-traveled way of any federal-aid or state highway within the State, except for the following:

- 1) Directional and other official signs and notices;
- 2) Signs, displays, and devices advertising the sale or lease of the property upon which they are located.
- 3) Signs, displays, and devices advertising activities conducted on the property upon which they are located.
- 4) Signs lawfully in existence on October 22, 1965 that have been determined as landmark signs.

§264-6 State highway not to be disturbed without permit. No person or government agency, whether federal, state, or county, shall, in any manner or for any purpose do any of the following acts without a written permit from the director of transportation or the director's authorized representative:

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(2) Place, erect, leave, or store any structure, motor or other vehicle, equipment, or any other object wholly or partially within the right-of-way of any state highway; provided that this paragraph shall not apply to the holding or displaying of movable signs, for the purpose of carrying on political campaign activities.

§445-112 Where and when permitted. No person shall erect, maintain, or use a billboard or display any outdoor advertising device, except as herein provided:

* * *

(11) Signs urging voters to vote for or against any person or issue, if erected not more than forty-five days before, and removed not less than ten days after, the election in which the person is a candidate or in which the issue is to be voted upon.

§11-215 Advertising. All political advertisements must contain the name and address of the candidate, committee, party, or person paying for the advertisement. In addition, advertisements supporting or opposing a candidate must have a prominent notice that the advertisement has or does not have the approval and authority of the candidate. Bumper stickers and other small campaign items are not covered by this requirement.

§445-113 Regulation by counties. Except for outdoor advertising devices authorized under section 445-112 (16) and (17), the several counties may adopt ordinances regulating billboards and outdoor advertising devices not prohibited by section 445-111 to 445-121.

§11-132 Electioneering. "...(a) The precinct officials shall post in a conspicuous place, prior to the opening of the polls, a map designated an area of two hundred feet from the perimeter of the polling place and its appurtenances. Any person who remains of loiters within an area of two hundred feet from the perimeter of the polling place and its appurtenances for the purpose of campaigning shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. For the purposes of this section, a polling place and its appurtenances shall include:

- The building in which the polling place is located;
- (2) Any parking lot adjacent to the building and routinely used for parking at the building;
- (3) The routes of access between the building and any parking lot; and
- (4) Any route of access between any public thoroughfare and the polling place to ensure and open and accessible ingress and egress to and from the polling place for voters...
- "...(d) Within the appropriate boundary as established in subsection (a), and the building in which the polling place is located, the display or distribution of campaign posters, signs, or other campaign materials for the purpose of soliciting votes for or against any person or political party or position on a question is prohibited. Any voter who displays campaign material in the polling place shall remove or cover that material before entering the polling place..."

RESOLUTIONS

House Resolution No. 193 (1986) requests that all candidates for elective office refrain from curbside sign-waving.

COUNTY ORDINANCES:

City & County of Honolulu

General Regulations:

There are no regulations at present prohibiting the use of political campaign signs fixed to the ground or to a structure.*

Campaign Headquarters Signs: Signs identifying the campaign headquarters of a political candidate are permitted, and are regulated as business signage. Such signs must be located on the premise of the headquarters, and are subject to the Land Use Ordinance (LUO) sign regulations regarding number, type and size for the underlying zoning district (Section 21-3.90-3). A sign permit needs to be issued by the Building Department (Honolulu Municipal Building) before a headquarters sign may be installed. Call the **Building Department Permit** Section at 523-4505 for more information and/or clarification of the rules governing campaign headquarters signs.

County of Hawaii

Hawaii County Code, Chapter 3(a)(1), Section 3-32, Exempt Signs:

(D) Political Campaign Sign.
Any sign or poster not
exceeding one square foot in
area, announcing a candidate
seeking political office;
provided that the sign or
poster is permitted only for a
period of sixty days
preceding a general or
special election and for a
period of ten days following
such election.

County of Maui

Maui County Code, Chapter 16.12A, Outdoor Signs:

Section 16.12A.090 — Signs authorized for all districts without a permit.

(D) Signs or posters not exceeding eighteen square feet in display surface, announcing candidates seeking political office; provided that such signs or posters shall be permitted only for a period of seventy-five days preceding a general or special election and for a period of ten days following such election.

County of Kauai

Ordinance No. 499
(Amending Chapter 15,
Article 4 of the Kauai County
Code) relating to Outdoor
Signs:

Section 15-4.6 Signs Not Requiring A Permit.

The following types of signs are exempt from the permit requirements of this Article, but must comply with all other County requirements:

- (a) Temporary Signs
- (2) Political Campaign Signs. Any sign which:
- (A) Identifies the headquarters of a political candidate. Only one sign per candidate shall be allowed, and it shall not exceed twenty-four (24) square feet.
- (B) Identifies and/or provides information about a political candidate or issue to be voted upon. It shall not exceed three (3) square feet, nor be posted more than

Window Signs: Political signs which are posted inside windows are permitted in the candidate's bona fide campaign office.

Bumper stickers: Bumper stickers are permitted on operable motor vehicles.

Hand-Carried Signs: Political signs are permitted when carried by individuals. However, handheld political signs from within the right-of-way of freeways is prohibited.

Aerial Advertising: No person shall use an aircraft to display any political sign or advertising device. forty-five (45) days prior to the date of the election to which it pertains, or within the right-of-way boundary, or be visible from, any federal-aid or state highway, nor remain posted more than ten (10) days after the election to which it pertains.

Political campaign signs fixed to the ground or structure were prohibited under Section 21-3.90-2(d) of the Land Use Ordinance (LUO). However, this prohibition was found unconstitutional by the courts in 1990.

FACT SHEET BOARD OF EDUCATION

PURPOSE (State Constitution, Article X, Section 3)

The Board of Education was created to formulate policy and to exercise control over the public school system through its appointed executive officer, the superintendent of education. State law requires that the board maintain jurisdiction over the internal organization and management of the public school system and that the board exercises its jurisdiction in a manner consistent with general laws.

GENERAL INFORMATION (HRS 13-1)

The State of Hawaii Board of Education consists of one (1) non-voting high school student member appointed by the Hawaii State Student Council and thirteen (13) members elected by the registered voters of two (2) at-large school board districts. The school board districts are:

School Board District I Island of Oahu (comprised of Representative Districts 15 through 51)

School Board District II
Islands of Hawaii, Maui, Lanai,
Molokai, Kahoolawe, Kauai, and Niihau
(comprised of Representative Districts
1 through 14)

Ten (10) members are elected at-large from the First School Board District:

Nomination papers must be obtained from and submitted to the Chief Election Officer in a prescribed manner. Contests are conducted in an at-large format, affording every registered voter of a school board district the opportunity to vote for each and every candidate seeking election from such school board district.

TERM OF OFFICE (HRS 13-4)

The term of office of members of the Board of Education is four (4) years, beginning on the day of the General Election of the year in which they are elected and ending on the day of the second General Election after their election. Members may be re-elected without restriction as to the number of terms.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS

PURPOSE (State Constitution)

The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) was established to hold title to all real and personal property to be held in trust for native Hawaiians and Hawaiians. (Article XII. Section 5)

The Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs was created to manage and administer the proceeds from the sale or other disposition of the lands, natural resources, minerals, and income derived from whatever sources for native Hawaiians and Hawaiians, including all income and proceeds from that pro rata portion of the trust referred to in the State Constitution, Article XII, section 4, for native Hawaiians. The board also formulates policy relating to the affairs of native Hawaiians and Hawaiians and exercises control over real personal property set aside by state, federal, or private sources and transferred to the board for native Hawaiians and Hawaiians. (Article XII, Section 6)

The board exercises control over the Office of Hawaiian Affairs through its executive officer, the administrator of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, who is appointed by the board. (Article XII, Section 6)

GENERAL INFORMATION (HRS §13D-1)

The members of the Board of Trustees, Office of Hawaiian Affairs, are elected at-large by qualified voters in the State of Hawaii who are of Hawaiian ancestry. The board is comprised of the following nine (9) members:

- one (1) resident trustee from the Island of Hawaii
- one (1) resident trustee from the Island of Maui
- one (1) resident trustee from the Island of Molokai
- one (1) resident trustee from the Island of Kauai
- one (1) resident trustee from the Island of Oahu
- four (4) at-large trustees with no Island residency required

QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS (HRS §13D-2)

- Hawaiian ancestry
- Currently registered OHA voter
- Residency on island for seats requiring residency
- Meets provisions (resign to run) of Article II, Section 7 of the Hawaii State Constitution
- Does not hold any other public office in state or county government

ELECTION OF MEMBERS (HRS §13D-4)

Members of the Board of Trustees, Office of Hawaiian Affairs, are elected in a special election held in conjunction with the general election in every even-numbered year. Nomination papers must be obtained from and submitted to the Chief Election Officer in a prescribed manner. Contests are conducted in an at-large format, affording every qualified voter of Hawaiian ancestry in the State of Hawaii the opportunity to vote for each and every candidate seeking election for any seat or jurisdiction.

TERM OF OFFICE (HRS §13D-5)

The term of office of members of the Board is four (4) years beginning on the day of the special election held in conjunction with the general election of the year in which they are elected and ending on the day of the special election held in conjunction with the second general election after their election. Members of the Board may be re-elected without restriction as to the number of terms.

BECOME A PRECINCT OFFICIAL

IT'S FUN! IT'S REWARDING!

Assisting your neighbors and fellow citizens to vote is a fun, challenging, and rewarding experience. This is your opportunity to volunteer your services to the community, and at the same time gain first-hand knowledge and experience in the electoral process.

WHEN ARE THE ELECTIONS?

Primary Election: Saturday, September 21, 1996 General Election: Tuesday, November 5, 1996

HOW LONG WILL I BE WORKING?

The polls are open from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM. Generally, Precinct Officials arrive one hour before the polls open and leave one hour after the polls close.

WHAT ARE THE MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS?

By State Law, each Precinct Official must meet all of the following requirements:

- Be 16 years old on or before June 30, 1996;
- Be a registered voter in the State of Hawaii;
- Be able to read and write English;
- Not be a candidate, parent, spouse, sibling, or child of a candidate;
 and
- Attend a training session and pass a certification exam.

WHAT WILL I BE DOING?

There are several positions available. The following are job descriptions and qualifications:

Chairperson's Duties:

- Manages the precinct and is responsible for the security and integrity of ballots issued and votes cast.
- Organizes and supervises precinct official activity.
- Organizes and supervises voter activity.
- Ensures that all election procedures are correctly followed.
- Receives and returns the precinct supply box before and after each election.
- Maintains inventory and control of all ballots and ballot boxes.
- Completes all election day documents correctly.
- Delivers all unissued ballots to a centralized, secure location following the close of the polling place.

General Qualifications:

- Must be of the same party as the Governor. (HRS §11-72)
- Experience in at least two elections.
- Experience as a Voter Assistance Official desirable.
- Meets all other minimum requirements.

Voter Assistance Official (VAO) Duties:

- Assists the Chairperson in managing the precinct.
- Assists voters and administers special procedures including: spoiled ballots; pollbook corrections; questionable address; curbside voting; language assistance (in designated precincts only).
- Assists the Chairperson in completing all election day documents.

General Qualifications:

- Experience in at least one election desirable.
- Meets all other minimum requirements.

Precinct Official (PO):

- Performs all station procedures as directed by the Chairperson.
- Meets all minimum requirements.

Standby Precinct Official:

- Reports to Election Headquarters on election morning for dispatch to precincts requiring additional staffing.
- Responsible for Precinct Official duties.
- Personal transportation required.
- If precincts do not require additional staffing, the Standby Official will still be compensated the full rate.
- Meets all minimum requirements.

Alternate:

- Stands-by at home election morning for dispatch to precincts requiring additional staffing.
- May be contacted prior to election day to replace a Precinct Official who is unable to work.
- Responsible for Precinct Official duties.
- If contacted to work in a precinct on election day, the Alternate will be compensated at the rate for Precinct Official.
- If precincts do not require additional staffing, the Alternate will be compensated \$5.
- If contacted to work but declines, the Alternate will not be compensated.
- Must meet all minimum requirements.

HOW WILL I KNOW WHAT TO DO ON ELECTION DAY?

Everyone is required to attend at least one training session. Precinct Officials will be instructed in the standard operating procedures for each station within the precinct. Your Chairperson will assign you to rotate through all the stations during the day and to any additional duties that may be required.

Chairpersons and Voter Assistance Officials will also attend a special procedures class. Before the General Election, Chairpersons and Voter Assistance Officials will attend a 1 1/2 hour briefing to review General Election procedures and pick up the precinct supply box.

WHEN IS TRAINING?

Training sessions are held between June and September. The Precinct Operations staff will schedule you to attend a convenient training session in your area.

WHERE WILL I WORK?

State Law requires Precinct Officials to work in the precinct in which they vote. However, if no vacancy exists in your precinct, you will be placed in a precinct within your district. If no vacancy exists within your district, you will be placed in a neighboring district. The earlier you volunteer to work, the better your chances for working close to home!

WILL I BE PAID?

Yes! The compensation rates for the 1996 elections are:
