You are eligible if you:

- Are registered to vote in Montgomery * County
- Do not hold or are not a candidate for ★ any public or political party office
- Enjoy meeting people and serving the \star public
- Are detail oriented and can speak, read ± and write the English Language
- Can provide your own transportation to * the polls.

When are Election Days, and what are the hours worked?

For the year 2002:

PRIMARY ELECTION DAY **Tuesday, September 10**

GENERAL ELECTION DAY Tuesday, November 5

Election Judges arrive at the polling place by 6:00 AM on election days to set up and must remain until the polling place is cleaned up, about 9:00 PM. Polls are open for voting from 7:00 AM - 8:00 PM.

Who works as an Election Judge?

Just about everyone! Senior citizens and new citizens; registered voters who work full-time, part-time; self-employed, retired and not employed.

What does an Election Judge do?

Most Elections Judges work at polling places; duties include:

- ★ Arriving at the polling place by 6:00 am
- ★ Setting up voting booths, tables, and signs to prepare the polling place for voting
- ★ Serving voters by checking their names on lists and processing ballots
- ★ Instructing voters on the use of voting machines
- ★ Maintains the security of voting materials and closing the polling place.

A smaller number of officials work as Stand-by Judges.

Is training provided?

Yes, training will be arranged and attendance is required by law.


Will I work at my own polling place?



Where possible, an Election Judge is assigned to work at their own polling place, but if no vacancies are available, you may be asked to work at a nearby precinct.

Is an Election Judge paid?

Yes, a stipend is paid for each election served.


