YOU CAN'T VOTE IF YOU'RE NOT REGISTERED



REGISTER AT YOUR CITY OR COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE

(or at the polls on Primary Election Day)

VOTE and keep your registration current.

- You are registered for 1982 if you voted in the 1980 General Election (Wyoming maintains permanent registry lists of voters. You need only register once in your life, provided you vote in each general election and do not move.)
- If you move to a different county you must re-register.
- If you move to a different precinct or change your name, notify your County Clerk.
- And, if you have questions about your registration or where you vote — call your COUNTY CLERK.

REGISTRATION IS SIMPLE

Sign an OATH stating:

- You are a bona fide resident. (This is the place where you actually and physically reside and to which, when you are absent, you have the intention of returning.)
- Your date of birth (you must be at least 18 years old on election day).
- You are a U.S. Citizen.

ABSENTEE REGISTRATION AND VOTING

If need be, you can register and vote absentee. Call or write your County Clerk for details.

Remember to return your absentee ballot immediately to assure it will be delivered to the County Clerk's Office by 7 p.m. on election day.

VOTING IN THE PRIMARY

At the PRIMARY ELECTION, voters will ELECT college, school board, and hospital district trustees and precinct committeemen and committeewomen. Voters will NOMINATE candidates for national, state, county and municipal offices.

- You must declare a *political party affiliation* in order to vote for political party candidates at the Primary Election.
- This declaration can be made at the time you register or at the polls on Primary Election Day.
- If you do not want to declare a party preference, you can only vote on nonpartisan candidates and issues at the Primary.

At the GENERAL ELECTION, voters will ELECT national, state, county and municipal officers; vote on retention of Supreme, District and County Court Judges, and vote on three proposed amendments to the Wyoming Constitution.

CANDIDATE FILINGS

File your application for office anytime from **July 2nd** through **July 16th** with:

- SECRETARY OF STATE for federal and state offices, including state legislature.
- COUNTY CLERK for county offices, school, college board and hospital district trustees, and precinct committeemen and precinct committeewomen.
- CITY CLERK for municipal offices.

If you wish to be on the General Election Ballot as an INDEPENDENT, file your PETI-TION anytime from August 4th through September 17th.
