





- Arlington's schools are the cornerstone of a strong community. Arlington's schools are used day and night, all year long. Our schools focus on academics, but they also provide a place for art classes for seniors, aerobics for young adults, summer programs and more. Using a building so intensively creates enormous wear and tear.
- The \$29.1 million school bond package would pay for major renovation at Oakridge, Key and Tuckahoe; technology cabling for high schools and middle schools; roofs at Yorktown and Jamestown; and design work for Drew and Science Focus. Also, the bond would pay for design work and classroom space for several hundred students who are now in crowded buildings in south Arlington.
- Arlington needs its green space. The park bond would acquire and develop park land and make improvements at playgrounds, athletic fields, and tennis and basketball courts such as Barcroft's.
- The street bond would pay for paving streets, sidewalks, hiking/biking trails, beautification, streetscape and neighborhood improvements.
- The Metro bond would pay for construction and rehabilitation.
- Putting off needed repairs and improvements costs Arlington citizens more money down the road. Arlington has a AAA/aaa bond rating the best there is. Authorizing the renovations now is efficient and wise.
