

PUBLIC OPINION IN TAJIKISTAN 2010 FINDINGS FROM AN IFES SURVEY





Methodological Details



•

- Fieldwork conducted between December 18, 2009 and January 6, 2010
- Fieldwork and data processing conducted by the research center Sharq
- Sample size: 1,500 of the adult population 18+
- Sample is representative at the national level
- Data weighted by region to reflect a small oversample in MBAO region
- Margin of error for national sample: ±2.53% at a 95% confidence level

Demographic Breakdown of Sample



- Men (49%), Women (51%)
- Ethnic breakdown of sample: Tajik (79%), Uzbek (15%), Russian (1%), Other (5%)
- Age breakdown: 18-24 (25%), 25-34 (21%), 35-44 (24%), 45-54 (18%), 55-64 (8%), 65+ (4%)
- Education breakdown: Primary or less (3%), Some or Complete Secondary (56%), Technical/Specialized Secondary (17%), At least some university (24%)
- Employment situation: Working full-time (22%),
 Working part-time (8%), Self-employed (10%), Not Employed (15%), Homemaker (26%), Student (7%),
 Pensioner/Invalid (8%)



Satisfaction with Overall Situation in Country, Trend










"How would you describe the current economic situation in our country -- is it very good, fairly good, fairly bad, or very bad?" (n=1,500)



Household Income








"And how would you describe the current economic situation of your household -- is it very good, fairly good, fairly bad, or very bad?" (n=1,500)

Assessment of Household Economic Situation 2004 vs 2010
















Men and women mostly see the same inequalities, but with women more likely to see inequalities in access to jobs, household responsibilities, and domestic violence

"How likely is it that you would vote for a woman candidate, if she was as equally qualified as the male candidate?"





Perceived Government Respect of Rights and Freedoms














"How fair do you expect the February 2010 elections to be?" (n=1,500)
















"If you were to register yourself or a family member or change your information or a family member's information on the voter list, would you know where to go?" (n=1,500)



Likelihood of Voting in Upcoming Elections









Knowledge of the self-government elections




Awareness of Select Political Parties by Region












"How necessary are political parties for democracy in Tajikistan?" (n=1,500)



"Whose interests do you think political parties in Tajikistan represent?" (n=1,500)




"Are there clear differences between the various political parties in how they would propose to solve the important problems facing Tajikistan?" (n=1,500)



"What are your feelings about saying that you are a citizen of Tajikistan: proud, content, indifferent, discontent, ashamed?" (n=1,500)








Role of Religion in Politics








"In your opinion, what role should religion play in politics?" (n=1,500)








"To what extent does religion influence the important decisions you make in your life?" (n=1,500)







"As you probably know, Tajikistan is a secular state. Do you believe Tajikistan should remain a secular state or become an Islamic state?" (n=1,500)


Can you please describe what does an Islamic state mean to you? % of those who want Tajikistan to become an Islamic state (n=94)

Frequency of Using Different Information Sources









