Pre-Election Survey

February 13 and 25 2,410 Nigerians

Post-Election Survey

May 3 and 10, 2007 (except in Osun state where interviewing was delayed until May 18th to May 20th)

2,417 Nigerians

- •Survey written and overseen by IFES
- •Fieldwork carried out by Practical Sampling International
- •Interviews conducted in all 36 Nigerian states and the federal capital territory and are representative of the Nigerian adult population.

•The survey was paid for by the Department for International Development (DfID) under IFES' "Nigerian Election Support 2007" program.




Post-election increase in the power of voting

Equally split in belief in fairness of 2007 elections


How free and fair were the 2007 presidential and parliamentary elections?

Almost half think 2007 elections less free and fair than those in 2003


Compared to the 2003 elections, were these elections...

Assessment of elections becoming more divided over time


How free and fair were these elections?



How satisfied or dissatisfied you were with the following aspects of the 2007 Presidential and Parliamentary elections
















How likely are the following leaders to make improvements or progress on the biggest issues facing Nigeria
