

Current Political Situation in Libya Compared to Year Ago










Confidence Levels in Libyan Institutions (by region)








Awareness of Libyan Political Agreement (LPA)








Satisfaction with Libyan Political Dialogue








Optimism for a Durable Outcome from the Political Dialogue








Best Design for a Successful Dialogue Process in Libya








Most Likely to Succeed in Leading Libya out of Current Crisis










Most Important Element of Constitutional Reform








Preferred Sequence of Events for Political Transition























Confidence in HNEC to Organize Credible Elections





Those who express a lack of confidence in HNEC provide the following reasons:

- Lack of credibility among the institution (14%)
- HNEC is not qualified/experienced (9%)
- Lack of security (9%)
- Lack of information (9%)


Confidence in HNEC is highest among Libyans in West. Residents of Tripoli express the lowest rates of confidence in HNEC



Views on the Importance of Elections






- Elections are very important; every Libyan should absolutely participate










Current Voter Registration Status








Likelihood of Voting in Constitutional Referendum










Likelihood of Voting (by gender)








Likelihood of Voting (by age)














Influence of Others in Previous Elections
















Willingness to Have a Women Representative in Parliament










Support for Gender Quotas in Parliamentary Elections









Support for Political Candidates with Disabilities









Participation of Persons with Disabilities in Elections














Opinions on Women's Access to Freedoms (by gender)










Attitudes on Freedom of Movement (by Gender)










Tolerance of Violence Between Married Couples




