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

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Foreword

Due to the large scale of the main sample in this survey (N = 3,560), a meaningful analysis may be conducted which examines the 10 regions of the Russian Federation rather than the four combined zones that are commonly used. This provides a richer understanding of the political environment and will assist in targeting voter education efforts.


The 10 regions outlined on the map on the next page are as follows:

The size of each region is based on its contribution to the total population of the Russian Federation. Each region is proportionate to the population by age. For the most part, the regions are also generally proportionate to the national figures for men and women. In the North Caucasus, however, 66% of the respondents are men and 34% women. Anna Andreenkova of CESSI attributes this to cultural practices in the region. That is, the North Caucasus is a heavily Muslim region with a traditionally male-dominated society. One other region, East Siberia, also has a majority male sample (54%) with 46% female.

OVERVIEW

- The highest levels of interest in politics and government are found in the Urals (45% interested) and the North Caucasus (43%). The lowest levels are shown in the Volga (22% interested) and East Siberia (24%).
- ✓ The economic crisis is the number one problem in all regions except Centralno-Chernozemnyi where quality of life issues top the list.
- ✓ Satisfaction with the direction of the country is highest in the Urals (15%) and North Caucasus (10%). Satisfaction is lowest in the North/Northwest (3%) and the Center (5%).
- ✓ Optimism about the political situation is highest in the Urals (28% better), East Siberia (22%) and West Siberia (24%). The Volga (40% worse) and Far East (40% worse) are the most pessimistic regions. The North Caucasus have higher scores in both directions (24% better-41% worse).
- Voters in two regions, North/Northwest and East Siberia, express an above-average desire to continue economic reforms. At the same time, voters in West Siberia, the Urals, Volgo-Vyatsky, the North Caucasus, and the Far East have an above-average desire to return to state control of the economy.
- Several regions Centralno-Chernozemnyi, Volgo-Vyatsky, the Urals, and East Siberia exhibit a greater interest in using western countries as development models. West Siberia, the North Caucasus, and the Volga region on the other hand, are more likely to say that Russia serves as its own best model.

In the upcoming Duma elections, voters in the North Caucasus are the most likely to vote. The following table outlines the "definitely voting" scores for the entire region and for young voters (age 17-35) in each area.

- Support for the computerization of elections is strong in all regions.
- Voters in the North Caucasus and the Urals are the most likely to vote for a candidate who is affiliated with a political party.
- Although party definition is a difficult problem nationwide, parties face a major challenge in the eastern regions where a high number of voters perceive no clear differences between the parties on major issues.

There is a clear need for voter education in all regions. A majority in all regions say they don't have enough information about their rights with regard to the authorities; at least a plurality in all regions say they didn't have enough information about candidates or parties in the 1993 elections; a large majority in every region say they are not familiar with their voting rights, and there are widespread misperceptions about who may and may not vote.

NORTH/NORTHWEST

Political Environment

- This region, which includes St. Petersburg, has only average interest in politics and government (32% interested-66% not interested) but is more dissatisfied with the current situation in the Russian Federation than all other regions. Only 3% are satisfied and 93% are dissatisfied.
- Their reasons for dissatisfaction mirror the national results, but with somewhat greater intensity. 67% mention inflation, 58% crime, 57% standard of living, 39% the situation in Chechnya, 37% chaos/instability, and 27% social and moral decay. All of these scores are higher than the national average.
- According to respondents in this region, the top five problems facing the country are the economic crisis (31%), quality of life (13%) ethnic conflicts (9%), political leadership (8%), and peace (6%). The main reasons they are dissatisfied are inflation (67%), crime (58%), standard of living (57%), Chechnya (39%), general chaos and instability (37%).
- Voters in the North/Northwest are somewhat less pessimistic than the nation, but no more optimistic, about the future political situation in the country. In all, 19% say the situation will be better, 29% worse, and 36% say it will stay the same. The same situation holds for their view of the economic situation as 22% think things will get better, 33% worse, and 31% think things will stay the same.
- These voters are more likely than the average to say that economic reforms should continue (22%) but 48% say the country should return to a system where the state controls much of the economy.
- Voters in the North/Northwest are less likely than average to say that Russia is a democracy. A bare one-point plurality (45%) say it is while 44% say it is not.
- As in most regions, respondents are evenly divided on whether political power in the country should be centralized (35%) or decentralized (35%).
- Besides Russia herself (32%) voters in this region also look to the United States (14%) as a model for development. Next is Germany (8%) and Sweden (7%).

- Voters in the region have a slightly more western orientation than the nation as a whole. That is, 33% say Russia would benefit from an orientation toward the West, 5% say the East, 20% say both, and 31% neither.
- Of all the regions, the North/Northwest is the most reliant on media organizations or personalities (64%) for information when making voting decisions. 92% say National Channel 1 is useful and 90% call Channel 2 useful. In comparison with the rest of the nation, a high percentage say that local television programs (70%), local radio programs (68%), and discussions with friends and family (77%) are useful while somewhat fewer (66%) say that newspapers are useful sources. Voters in this region say that National Channel 1 (38%) and discussions with friends and family (24%) were the most important in helping them decide how to vote.

Institutions and Officials

- The pessimism toward institutions and officials found in other areas is also prevalent in the North/Northwest. A 57% majority say that official corruption is very common and 29% fairly common. Only 5% say corruption is rare. Also, 59% say that elected officials in Moscow are only interested in helping themselves and only 5% say they are interested in improving our lives. A 54% majority say their elected officials are not capable of making any improvement in their circumstances. However, an above-average 41% of this region's voters believe elected officials can make a difference.
- President Yeltsin's job approval in this region is virtually identical to the nation as a whole. Only 20% approve and 69% disapprove. Similarly, just 16% approve of the State Duma's performance and 56% disapprove. Fewer can rate the Federation Council but the trend there is the same as 15% approve and 38% disapprove.

Attitudes Toward the Electoral System

- The region shares the national skepticism regarding free and fair elections. That is, 52% believe there was at least some fraud in 1993 and 48% say there will be fraud in the 1995 elections.
- Those who believe fraud will occur divide responsibility in similar portions as the national sample. However, they are less likely to name the CEC and more likely than average to name local executive authorities.

- Again on a par with the national average, few voters in this region witnessed any improper or fraudulent voting acts. Just 2% saw poll watchers or local/election officials try to influence votes, and 6% say they felt their ballot wouldn't be kept secret. Group voting, however, has a high score (23%) -- second only to the North Caucasus (31%). Only one person reports seeing material or financial incentives being offered to voters.
- Knowledge about the Central Election Commission is similar to the rest of the nation. Only 7% have read or heard a fair amount or more and 50% have heard nothing at all.
- Support for the computerization of elections is strong as 75% are in favor (59% quite a lot) and only 9% are opposed.
- Voters in this region are significantly more likely to favor allowing candidates for the State Duma (35%), the Federation Council (35%) and the Presidency (30%) to receive private contributions. However, they are also more likely (71%) to say that a ceiling should be established for such contributions. Further, 70% support a minimum voting threshold for validating elections.

- The North/Northwest is one of three regions (with the Urals and East Siberia) that are more likely to want to increase the number of Duma representatives who are elected from party lists. In all, 29% want more representatives elected from party lists, 7% want more from single mandate constituencies, 27% would like the system to stay the same and 35% don't know.
- A 61% majority say the Federation Council should be directly elected, 7% call for indirect elections, and 6% think members should be appointed by the President.

Voting Patterns

- Projected turnout for the Duma elections in the North/Northwest is comparable to the national average. Overall, 75% say they will vote and 18% will not. The percentage of those saying they are certain to vote is 39%. Among those age 17-35, 30% are likely voters.
- Planned turnout for the presidential elections is also high at 77%. Again, however, somewhat fewer (42%) are certain to vote in comparison with the national average of 46%.
- The North/Northwest has the highest percentage of people who believe that by voting, people can actually change something in the life of our country (65%). Only 30% say this is not possible.
- The following table rank orders the results of the Presidential ballot test in the region.

Political Parties

Of all the regions, the North/Northwest is the most likely to say that political parties are necessary to Russian democracy (78%). Only 8% say they are not necessary. A majority (57%) express a strong belief that parties are necessary.

Voters in the region are also the least likely to say that one party is the ideal (10%) and the most likely to call for several parties (54%).

However, they are split on whether there are clear differences between the parties (39% yes - 39% no) and the membership percentage (3%) is among the lowest in the land. In fact, the cell is too small for further analysis. Further, only 21% are more likely to vote for a candidate who is affiliated with a political party, 24% are more likely to vote for an unaffiliated candidate, and 42% say it makes no difference.

On the other hand, a 69% majority - again leading the nation - say that political parties speak to the issues that concern the Russian electorate.

Voter Education

Like the rest of the country, voter education efforts are needed in this region. Although the North/Northwest has the highest percentage in the country (56%) saying they received enough information from election officials that they understood the election process:

- Only 2% have a great deal of information about the Democratic process, 13% have a fair amount, 50% have not very much, and 28% have none at all. This last score is 6% higher than the national average.
- ✓ 77% agree (56% strongly) that they don't have enough information with regard to their rights with regard to the authorities.
- ✓ Just 36% say they received enough information about the candidates or parties to make a good choice in the 1993 Parliamentary elections and 46% did not.
- ✓ 15% are very or somewhat familiar with their voting rights.
- 26% didn't have enough information on how to check the voter registry and 29% had too little information on means of alternative voting.
- Misunderstandings about voting rights include the following: 35% believe a family member can vote on your behalf by presenting your passport; 29% think that those who do not speak Russian may not vote; 37% say that those who don't currently reside in Russia may not vote; 47% think those serving time in prison may vote, and 16% think it is not necessary to be inside the ballot booth when voting.

CENTER

- The Center also expresses average interest in politics and government (30% interested) and a high level of dissatisfaction (91%).
- Their reasons for dissatisfaction are slightly different than the national results. These voters are less concerned about inflation (56%) but are more likely to mention standard of living (53%), economic decline (32%), lack of political leadership (28%) and Social/Moral decay (26%). Otherwise, 51% mention crime, 36% the situation in Chechnya, and 35% chaos/instability.
- The top five problems for this region are the economy (27%), quality of life (15%), political leadership (10%), peace (9%), and ethnic conflicts (7%).
- Central voters are fairly pessimistic about the political outlook as just 15% say the
 political situation will improve and 37% say it will worsen over the next twothree years.
- On the economy, only 18% say the situation will be better, 42% worse, and 26% say it will stay the same.
- These voters are no more likely than the average to say that economic reforms should continue (16%) but are less likely (44%) to say the country should return to a system where the state controls much of the economy.
- Voters in the Center are also less likely than average to say that Russia is a democracy. Like the North/Northwest, a bare one-point plurality (45%) say it is while 44% say it is not.
- Voters in the Center are less likely to say political power should be decentralized
 (29%) while 34% believe it should be centralized.
- Besides Russia herself (29%) voters in this region also look to the United States (12%) as a model for development. Next is Germany (7%) and Sweden (7%).

- 27% say Russia would benefit from an orientation toward the West, 6% say the East, 18% say both, and 33% neither.
- Voters in the Center express an average reliance on media organizations or personalities (55%) for information when making voting decisions. 84% say National Channel 1 is useful and 78% call Channel 2 useful. Both scores are below average. In comparison with the rest of the nation, a lower percentage say that local television programs (40%), and local radio programs (46%) are useful. Discussions with friends and family (68%) are perceived to be useful. An average number (68%) say that newspapers are useful sources. Voters in this region say that National Channel 1 (39%) and Channel 2 (15%) were the most important in helping them decide how to vote.

Institutions and Officials

- The pessimism toward institutions and officials found in other areas is present in the Center. A 58% majority say that official corruption is very common and 28% fairly common. Only 4% say corruption is rare. Also, 59% say that elected officials in Moscow are only interested in helping themselves and 3% say they are interested in improving our lives. A 61% majority say their elected officials are not capable of making any improvement in their circumstances making the Center the second most pessimistic region on the relevance of elected officials. Only 31% of this region's voters believe elected officials can make a difference.
- President Yeltsin's job approval in this region is similar to the national numbers. Only 22% approve and 69% disapprove. As for the Duma, 20% approve of its performance and 57% disapprove. Disapproval of the Federation Council is also significantly high as 17% approve and 44% disapprove.

Attitudes Toward the Electoral System

- The region is highly skeptical regarding free and fair elections. That is, 56% believe there was at least some fraud in 1993, with a national high of 34% who think there was a great deal of fraud, and 50% say there will be fraud in the 1995 elections.
- Those who believe fraud will occur divide responsibility in similar portions as the national sample. However, they are more likely than average to name "all of these."

- Few voters in this region witnessed any improper or fraudulent voting acts. Just 4% saw poll watchers or local/election officials try to influence votes, and 4% say they felt their ballot wouldn't be kept secret. Just 12% witnessed group voting, one of the lowest percentages observed. Only 2% report seeing material or financial incentives being offered to voters.
- Knowledge about the Central Election Commission is similar to the rest of the nation. Only 8% have read or heard a fair amount or more and 48% have heard nothing at all.
- Support for the computerization of elections stands at 73% are in favor (55% quite a lot) and only 9% are opposed.
- Voters in this region strongly oppose allowing candidates for the State Duma (24%-57%), the Federation Council (23%-58%) and the Presidency (22%-60%) to receive private contributions. If contributions are allowed, 67% support a ceiling for the amounts. In all, 65% support a minimum voting threshold for validating elections.

- Voters in the Center are slightly less likely than the nation as a whole to want to increase the number of Duma representatives who are elected from party lists. In all, 20% want more representatives elected from party lists, 7% want more from single mandate constituencies, 30% would like the system to stay the same and 42% don't know.
- A 64% majority say the Federation Council should be directly elected, 10% want for indirect elections, and just 3% think members should be appointed by the President.

Voting Patterns

- Projected turnout for the Duma elections in the Center also compares to the national average. Overall, 75% say they will vote and 18% will not. The percentage of those saying they are certain to vote is 44%. 31% of all those age 17-35 are likely to vote.
- Planned turnout for the presidential elections is 76% and 49% are certain to vote
 3% above average.
- The Center has a low average vote efficacy score. That is, 51% believe that by voting, people can actually change something in the life of our country and 42% say this is not possible.
- The following table rank orders the results of the Presidential ballot test in the region.

Political Parties

The Center also exhibits strong support for the necessity of political parties. In all, 72% say that parties are necessary to Russian democracy and 51% feel strongly about that. Only 14% say they are not necessary.

Only 13% say that one party is the ideal and 45% call for several parties.

Voters in this region are also split on whether there are clear differences between the parties (38% yes - 39% no) and 6% say they are members of a party. Only 23% are more likely to vote for a candidate who is affiliated with a political party, 26% are more likely to vote for an unaffiliated candidate, and 36% say it makes no difference.

A 59% majority say that political parties speak to the issues that concern the Russian electorate.

Voter Education

Knowledge about the process is generally below average in the Central region and education efforts are clearly needed.

- 48% say they received enough information from election officials that they understood the election process:
- Only 2% have a great deal of information about the Democratic process, 12% have a fair amount, 56% have not very much, and 21% have none at all.
- ✓ 75% agree (49% strongly) that they don't have enough information with regard to their rights with regard to the authorities.
- ✓ Just 30% (-3% from average) say they received enough information about the candidates or parties to make a good choice in the 1993 Parliamentary elections and 45% did not.
- ✓ 13% are very or somewhat familiar with their voting rights.
- ✓ 21% didn't have enough information on how to check the voter registry.
- Misunderstandings about voting rights are at above average levels on several items include the following: 34% think that those who do not speak Russian may not vote 6% above average, and 61% think those serving time in prison may vote (+10%). Other substantial levels include the following responses: 33% believe a family member can vote on your behalf by presenting your passport; 36% say that those who don't currently reside in Russia may not vote, and 10% think it is not necessary to be inside the ballot booth when voting.

CENTRALNO-CHERNOZEMNYI

- Voters here are slightly below average in terms of their interest in politics and government (29% interested - 70% not interested) and exhibit high levels of dissatisfaction with the situation in the Russian Federation (6% satisfied - 87% dissatisfied).
- Their reasons for dissatisfaction are, for the most part, less intense than the national results. 55% mention inflation (-7%), 37% crime (-14%), 46% standard of living (-4%), 38% the situation in Chechnya (+2%), 18% chaos/instability (-14%), and 27% social and moral decay (-10%).
- Here, quality of life issues (19%) top the issue agenda followed by the economy (16%), peace (10%), ethnic conflicts (7%) and high prices (7%).
- The view of the political situation is on a par with the rest of the nation as 17% say the situation will get better and 32% say it will worsen. 20% say the economy will get better, 38% that it will get worse, and 27% that it will stay the same.
- These voters are less likely than the average to say that economic reforms should continue (15%) and to say the country should return to a system where the state controls much of the economy (46%). Nearly one in five (19%) don't know.
- A plurality (46%) say that Russia is a democracy and 39% say it is not.
- As in most regions, respondents are evenly divided on whether political power in the country should be centralized (35%) or decentralized (31%).
- Voters in this region are far less likely to say that Russia should be her own model for development (17% - 13% below average). Nearly as many (16%) say the United States (14%) as a model for development and 8% say Sweden. Germany is lower than usual at 4%.

- As in all regions, voters in the region have a more western than eastern orientation. 30% say Russia would benefit from an orientation toward the West, 9% say the East, 14% say both, and 20% neither.
- Voters here claim to be somewhat less reliant on media organizations or personalities (49%) and more reliant on themselves (25%) for information when making voting decisions. 82% say National Channel 1 is useful and 79% call Channel 2 useful. Fewer than normal say that local television programs (19%), local radio programs (46%), and discussions with friends and family (55%). 69% say that newspapers are useful sources. Although the top two sources are National Channel 1 (34%) and discussions with friends and family (11%), these numbers are low and 24% don't know which source is most important.

Institutions and Officials

- A 50% majority say that official corruption is very common and 30% fairly common. Only 7% say corruption is rare. Also, 59% say that elected officials in Moscow are only interested in helping themselves and 6% say they are interested in improving our lives. A 55% majority say their elected officials are not capable of making any improvement in their circumstances and 37% say they can make a difference.
- President Yeltsin's job approval in this region is below average at 14% while 69% disapprove. Just 20% approve of the State Duma's performance and 48% disapprove. Fewer can rate the Federation Council as 16% approve and 37% disapprove.

Attitudes Toward the Electoral System

- Skepticism regarding free and fair elections is lower than average in this region.
 That is, 50% believe there was at least some fraud in 1993 (-6%) and just 39% say there will be fraud in the 1995 elections (-9%).
- Those who believe fraud will occur give potential sources the following distribution:

- Although few voters in this region witnessed any improper or fraudulent voting acts, an above-average number (5%) witnessed financial incentives being offered to voters. 4% saw poll watchers or local/election officials try to influence votes, and 6% say they felt their ballot wouldn't be kept secret. Group voting, was at 15%.
- Knowledge about the Central Election Commission is lower in this region as only 5% have read or heard a fair amount or more and 61% have heard nothing at all (+10%).
- Support for the computerization of elections is below-average but still a majority as 68% are in favor (51% quite a lot) and only 12% are opposed.
- A 48% plurality of voters in this region who have an opinion oppose allowing candidates for the State Duma (48%), the Federation Council (48%) and the Presidency (53%) to receive private contributions. High percentages (29% average) have no opinion. A 53% majority say that a ceiling should be established for such contributions. 63% support a minimum voting threshold for validating elections.

- Voters in the Centralno-Chernozemnyi region show high "don't know" responses when asked about means of selecting the State Duma and Federation Council representatives. 15% would like to increase the number of Duma representatives who are elected from party lists, 6% want more from single mandate constituencies, 24% would like the system to stay the same and 52% don't know.
- A 50% majority say the Federation Council should be directly elected, 12% call for indirect elections, and 6% think members should be appointed by the President, 30% don't know.

Voting Patterns

- Projected turnout for the Duma elections in Centralno-Chernozemnyi is below the national average. Overall, 66% say they will vote and 21% will not. The percentage of those saying they are certain to vote (32%) is 9% below average.
- Planned turnout for the presidential elections is also below average at 69% (-7%). Only 40% say they definitely will vote as compared with the national average of 46%. Only 24% of those age 17-35 are likely voters.
- Vote efficacy in the region is fairly low as only 49% believe that by voting, people can actually change something in the life of our country and 43% say this is not possible.
- The following table rank orders the results of the Presidential ballot test in the region. As with other variables, a high number of voters are undecided.

Political Parties

 60% say that political parties are necessary to Russian democracy and 14% say they are not necessary. Only 38% strongly believe that parties are necessary.

A 39% plurality say that several parties is an ideal situation while 15% say that one party is the ideal.

35% feel there are clear differences between the parties and 33% say there are not. VOLGO-VYATSKY

- Voters in Volgo-Vyatsky are also somewhat less interested than average in politics and government (28%). Satisfaction levels are average as well with 9% satisfied and 85% dissatisfied with the situation in the country. They are more likely than average to mention inflation (67%), standard of living (56%), and chaos (36%) as reasons for dissatisfaction. At the same time they are less likely to mention crime (45%), and Chechnya (26%).
- Concerns here include the economy (20%), quality of life (18%), political leaders (9%), high prices (9%), and unemployment (8%).

- Voters here are mainly reliant on media organizations or personalities (55%) for information when making voting decisions. 88% say National Channel 1 is useful and 76% call Channel 2 useful. Fewer than average (47%) say that local television programs are worthwhile. They give very high marks to discussions with friends and family (76%). 71% say that newspapers are useful sources. The top two sources are National Channel 1 (44%) and discussions with friends and family (13%).

Radio may be an important vehicle here as 57% say local radio programs are useful and 40% use other radio programs. Another 46% say that magazine articles are useful, 30% find posters helpful, and 44% say that meetings with candidates are useful (+9%).

Institutions and Officials

Local radio may be useful (55%). 44% say that magazine articles are useful. The top two sources are National Channel 1 (45%) and Channel 2 (9%).

Institutions and Officials

- A 54% majority say that official corruption is very common and 27% fairly common. Only 5% say corruption is rare. Also, 62% say that elected officials in Moscow are only interested in helping themselves and 4% say they are interested in improving our lives. NORTH CAUCASUS

They also have a higher level of satisfaction (10%) with the direction of the country than any region except the Urals (15%). Still, 88% are dissatisfied.
- They are far more likely than average (46%) to cite economic decline as a reason for their dissatisfaction (+17%). Other reasons for voter dissatisfaction receive the following scores. Inflation is at 65%, crime (50%), standard of living (55%), unemployment (29%), chaos (34%), and Chechnya (21%). Unemployment and Chechnya mentions are both below average.
- In open-ended questioning, the economic crisis (25%) and quality of life concerns (18%) dominate the issue agenda but political leaders (13%), chaos and disorder (8%), prices (5%) and peace (5%) are also notable concerns.

Voters are less reliant on media organizations or personalities (44%) for information when making voting decisions. 23% are self-reliant and 7% rely on information from government leaders. 91% say National Channel 1 is useful and 87% call Channel 2 useful. Local television programs receive a 53% useful score. 59% say discussions with friends and family are useful. Newspapers are well-regarded as 78% say that newspapers are useful sources (+9%). Local radio may be useful (55%). 47% say that magazine articles are useful. The score for meeting candidates in person is 6% above average at 41%. The top sources are National Channel 1 (40%), Channel 2 (17%) and newspapers (17%).

Institutions and Officials

The Urals voters are, however, more likely to report that family members (27%) and political party officials (16%) tried to pressure them to vote a certain way. Further, 6% saw poll watchers and 6% saw local/election officials try to influence votes, and 4% say they felt their ballot wouldn't be kept secret. Group voting here is at 15%.
- Voters in the Urals also have a higher than average knowledge score on the CEC. That is, 8% have read or heard a fair amount or more, and 42% have heard nothing at all (-9%). The CEC's job approval here is relatively high as a 34% plurality say they are doing their job well and just 22% poorly.
- Support for the computerization of elections is higher here than in any other region (79%) while 13% are opposed.
- Voters in this region tend to be more favorable toward allowing candidates for the State Duma (33%), the Federation Council (29%) and the Presidency (31%) to receive private contributions. Still, a majority oppose such contributions in all cases and 62% say that a ceiling should be established for such contributions. 72% support a minimum voting threshold for validating elections.

- 30% would like to increase the number of Duma representatives who are elected from party lists, 10% want more from single mandate constituencies, 39% would like the system to stay the same and 19% don't know.
- A 64% majority say the Federation Council should be directly elected, 15% call for indirect elections, and 6% think members should be appointed by the President. 14% don't know.

Voting Patterns

- Voters in the Urals are highly likely to vote. For the Duma elections, 80% say they will vote and 18% will not. However, the percentage of those saying they are certain to vote is only average at 43%. 34% of those age 17-35 are likely voters.
- Planned turnout for the presidential elections is 81% and 51% say they definitely will vote as compared with the national average of 46%.
- Vote efficacy in the region is very high as 62% (+9%) believe that by voting, people can actually change something in the life of our country and 35% say this is not possible.
- The following table rank orders the results of the Presidential ballot test in the region. Lebed has a strong lead, but Chernomyrdin also turns in a strong performance. There is a relatively low undecided level.

Political Parties

Voters in the Urals find political parties extremely relevant. In all 77% say that
political parties are necessary to Russian democracy and 17% say they are not
necessary. 48% strongly believe that parties are necessary.

43% feel that several parties is an ideal situation and 15% say that one party is the ideal.

The problem of party definition is apparent in the Urals. While 37% say there are clear differences between the parties, 48% say there are not. Membership is fairly high as 9% say they are members of a party. Interestingly, party membership here is not limited to the Communist Party. In fact, it appears that there is a good distribution of party loyalty as 21% are members of the Communist Party; 17% of Russia's Democratic Choice; 12% the LDPR; 11% Women of Russia; 10% Russia is Our Home; and 9% Yabloko. Accordingly, 31% are more likely to vote for a candidate who is affiliated with a political party, 29% are more likely to vote for an unaffiliated candidate, and 33% say it makes no difference.

66% say that political parties speak to the issues that concern the Russian electorate.

EAST SIBERIA

East Siberia is a study in contrasts. Voters here are more likely to support continued economic reforms, but less likely to say that political parties are necessary for democracy and much less likely to vote than those in other regions. They have a penchant for "outsider" candidates (Lebed, Yavlinsky, and Zhirinovsky top the list).

- Voters in East Siberia are much less interested in politics and government than any other region except the Volga. Only 24% are interested while 76% are not interested in politics and government. Only 8% are satisfied and 87% are dissatisfied.
- With two exceptions, the reasons for dissatisfaction are in line with national responses. However, 66% mention crime (15% above the national average) and 42% as compared with 16% nationally mention housing. Concerns about crime are mainly regarding threats to personal safety and property (30%). Other reasons for voter dissatisfaction include: inflation (65%), Chechnya (32%), standard of living (52%), unemployment (35%), chaos (32%).
- In open-ended questioning, the most important concerns are the economic crisis (29%) and quality of life (12%). Crime receives 10%.
- Regarding the political situation, 22% say it will get better over the next few years and 39% that it will get worse. On the economic front, the response is 25% better 36% worse.
- Support for continuing economic reforms is higher in East Siberia (32%) than in any other region. Only 34% want to return to state control.
- Voters in East Siberia are also more likely to say that Russia is a democracy. 55% say that Russia is a democracy and 34% say that it is not.
- Voters in the region are more likely to say that political power should be centralized (37%) while 33% think it should be decentralized.
- One third of all voters see Russia as a model for its own development (33%).
 20% mention the U.S., 4% Sweden, 2% Germany, 3% Switzerland and 8% Japan.
 6% say the Soviet Union (-1%).
- Only 15% say that Russia should be oriented toward neither the East nor the West. In all, 27% believe Russia would benefit from a western orientation, 5% say the East, and 31% both.

• Voters express a lower level of reliance on media organizations or personalities (33%) for information when making voting decisions. 35% are self-reliant, and 7% look to government leaders. 91% say National Channel 1 is useful and 77% call Channel 2 useful. Local television programs receive a 52% useful score (-1%). 51% say discussions with friends and family are useful. 78% say that newspapers are useful sources. Local radio is at 49%. 35% say that magazine articles are useful. 33% say that posters are useful. The top sources are National Channel 1 (34%) and newspaper articles (26%).

Institutions and Officials

- Perceptions of corruption are as follows: 52% say that official corruption is very common (-2%) and 40% say fairly common. 4% say that corruption is rare. 74% say that elected officials in Moscow are only interested in helping themselves and 1% say they are interested in improving our lives. 42% say their elected officials can make an improvement in their circumstances while 49% say they cannot.
- President Yeltsin's job approval score in this region is low as 17% approve and 78% disapprove. The Duma's approval score is 23% approve and 45% disapprove. 22% approve of the Federation Council and 40% disapprove.

Attitudes Toward the Electoral System

- Perceptions about past fraud are low in East Siberia as 50% believe there was at least some fraud in 1993 (-6%). However, 52% say there will be fraud in the 1995 elections (+4%).
- Voters in East Siberia are less likely to blame the CEC than those in other regions.

• 65% say the Federation Council should be directly elected, 14% call for indirect elections, and 3% think members should be appointed by the President.

Voting Patterns

- Voters in East Siberia are less likely to vote than most other areas. As in Centralno-Chernozemnyi, only 66% say they plan to vote in the Duma elections, and 28% say they will not -- more than any other region. Further, the percentage of those saying they are certain to vote is only 24%, the lowest in the 10 regions. Only 18% of those age 17-35 are likely voters.
- Projected turnout for the presidential elections is also low at 66% and with a definite vote of only 28% 18% below the national average of 46%. This is bad news for General Lebed, who leads in the region with 24% and Mr. Yavlinsky who is close behind with 19%.
- Vote efficacy scores in the region are at average levels. 54% (+2%) believe that by voting, people can actually change something in the life of our country and 41% (+1) say this is not possible.
- The following table rank orders the results of the Presidential ballot test in the region. Again, Lebed and Yavlinsky are far ahead of other contenders. Candidates who are currently in government do very poorly here. Zhirinovsky does better here than elsewhere in the nation.

Political Parties

Voters in East Siberia are less likely to say that political are necessary for Russian democracy. Only 54% hold this view as compared with 69% nationwide. 25% hold the contrary view and 20% don't know. Only 35% strongly believe that parties are necessary.

This is consistent with their view on the "ideal" number of political parties to have as 29% say several, 11% say one, and 14% feel that "none" is the ideal number.

The problem of party definition is quite pronounced in East Siberia. Fewer voters here (16%) say there are clear differences between the parties, while a 53% majority say there are not. Party membership levels are low as 5% say they are members of a party. It is not surprising, then, to find only 12% saying they are more likely to vote for a candidate who is affiliated with a political party, 29% who are more likely to vote for an unaffiliated candidate, and 50% who say it makes no difference.

Just 41% say that political parties speak to the issues that concern the Russian electorate and 33% say they do not. As a result, 30% pick "none" as their party of choice in the Duma ballot – a national high.

- ✓ Only 13% are very or somewhat familiar with their voting rights (-2%) and 31% are not at all familiar.
- √ 27% didn't have enough information on how to check the voter registry and 20% had too little information on means of alternative voting.
- Misunderstandings about voting rights include the following: 44% believe a family member can vote on your behalf by presenting your passport (tie for first); 38% say that those who don't currently reside in Russia may not vote. 48% say that prisoners may vote.
- A high percentage (36%) say that those who don't speak Russian may not vote.

Voter Education

- √ 45% say they received enough information from election officials so
 that they understood the election process;
- 2% have a great deal of information about the Democratic process, 17% have a fair amount, 50% have not very much, and 23% have none at all.
- ✓ 59% agree (41% strongly) that they don't have enough information with regard to their rights with regard to the authorities.
- ✓ 29% (-4%) say they received enough information about the candidates or parties to make a good choice in the 1993 Parliamentary elections and 52% did not.
- ✓ Only 13% are very or somewhat familiar with their voting rights (-2%) and 31% are not at all familiar.
- √ 27% didn't have enough information on how to check the voter registry and 20% had too little information on means of alternative voting.
