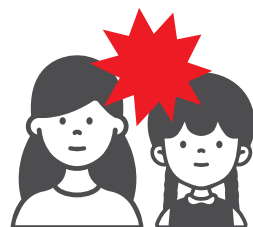

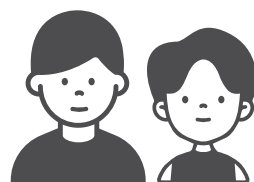

### SERVICES OFFERED

**Al Dar, Emergency Safe Sheltering** for women & girl survivors or at-risk of violence (& their children). Three new safe spaces act as COVID-19 isolation units before shelter admission.

**Men Centres** offering individual, couples, and group psychotherapy sessions to assist men in identifying positive and nonviolent coping strategies.

**Capacity building and awareness raising** for the general public, for activists, local and international NGOs, & stakeholders. Emergency response activities include enhancing front-liner capacities on dealing with affected individuals, & supporting them with self-care.

As part of emergency response activities, ABAAD has been offering **mental health support (emergency response)** for coping with trauma and grief, emergency food, lodging, and clothing services, hygiene and dignity kit distribution to vulnerable households from the affected areas (including families displaced to different governorates), and GBV response. **Development of educational resources and publications** for INGOs, UN agencies, government agencies, front-liners, and the general public

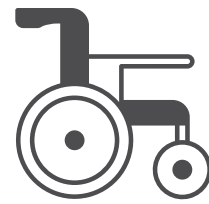

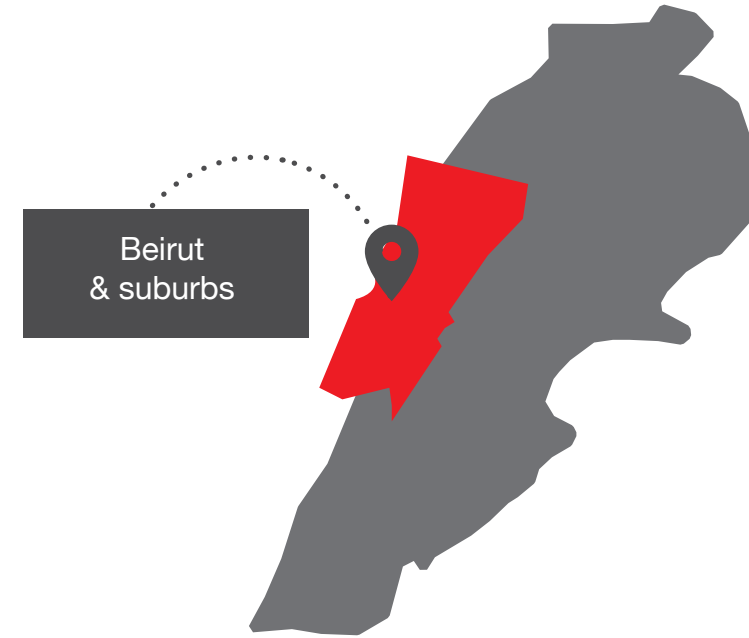

Leading assistive devices exchange (where the organisation accepts used devices and offers them to any person who needs them).

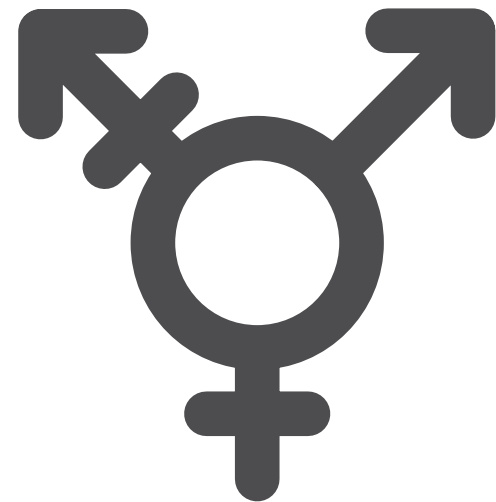

Provision of therapy sessions (Occupational therapy, physiotherapy, psychotherapy, psychosocial support).

Disability monitoring of PWD rights violations, referral to legal support

Accessibility and Physical location assessments: surroundings of PWD, following which LUPD works with individuals, families and communities to improve the situation. Assessments also inform programming.

Socio-economic development courses (marketing and management, vocational training, in-kind grants – subject to funding availability)

Provision of technical assistive devices, cash assistance, medication, and medical aids (diapers, tubes – subject to funding availability)

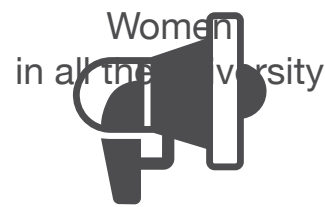
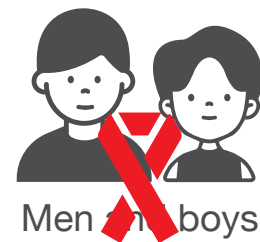

### AREAS OF OPERATION



#### URGENT Need

In Lebanon, People Living with HIV receive their treatment from the National Aids Programme. Once a year, they are required to renew their medical files. This requires costly testing, noting that PLHIV are not covered by private insurance and freelancers/artisans are not covered by Social Security, while employees with coverage avoid it because of the stigma and discrimination associated with HIV status.

Flu vaccines

Co-morbidity medication (high cost, unaffordable to PLHIV without NGO contribution)

Shelter & food boxes

### SERVICES OFFERED

Advocacy, awareness-raising, and capacity building activities for women in all their diversity

Working on the LEARN MENA project which highlights the interlinkage of HIV and GBV (since 2018)

National capacity building workshops on HIV, gender equality, awareness-raising, and communication skills, advocacy, and networking

Currently conducting a study on the dynamics between healthcare providers & People Living with HIV (misconceptions, prejudice, stigma, & discrimination)

Online sessions for MENA focal points (HIV and COVID, nutrition, and HIV, MH, drug, and self-care), PSS and individual follow-up // Individual psychosocial support to MENA Rosa peer educators, focal points, and front-liners

Distribution of food boxes and hygiene kits to beneficiaries in Lebanon (emergency)

Distribution of cash livelihood support to MENA Rosa network members (emergency)

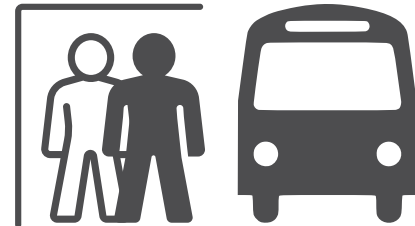

Contributing to building a map assessment of the Beirut blast's aftermath as part of the Open Map Lebanon community through collecting 3D imagery. The map is open source.

Launching the "Bus Line Heroes" campaign to support bus drivers affected by COVID-19 lockdowns and preventive efforts.

Liaising with different local organisations and academic institutions to improve work on public transportation in Lebanon.

Promoting the informal bus system, defending riders' rights, and empowering the mobility system.

Creating a COVID-19 protocol for informal transit and training bus drivers and riders on COVID-19 self-protection and prevention.

### SERVICES OFFERED

Online awareness-raising and messaging on sexual and reproductive health, mental health following the Beirut explosion, and peer educator outreach on dating apps

Field awareness-raising and testing (HIV/Hep B and C, syphilis) in blast-affected areas of Beirut and Mount Lebanon


Referrals to SIDC's sexual health clinic and other relevant service providers (needs-based)

Distribution of hygiene kits and harm reduction kits

Mental health support (psychotherapy and psychiatry) to individuals affected by the situation in Lebanon. The service is currently offered remotely as a COVID-19 precaution.

Specialised support for women and girls: distribution of dignity kits, STI testing, and gynaecological services (pap smears and vaginal culture)

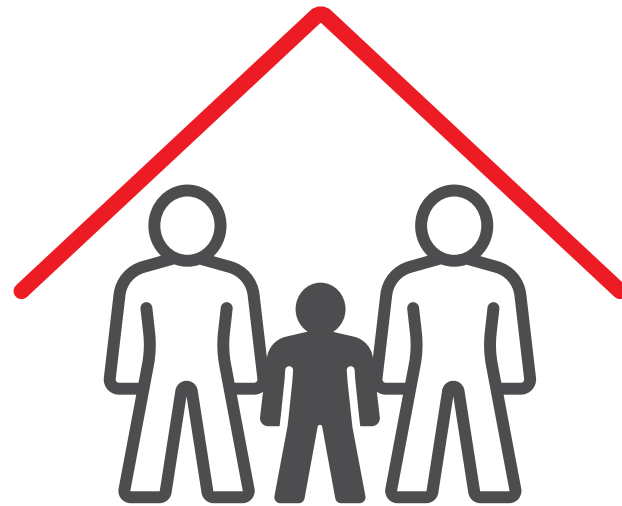

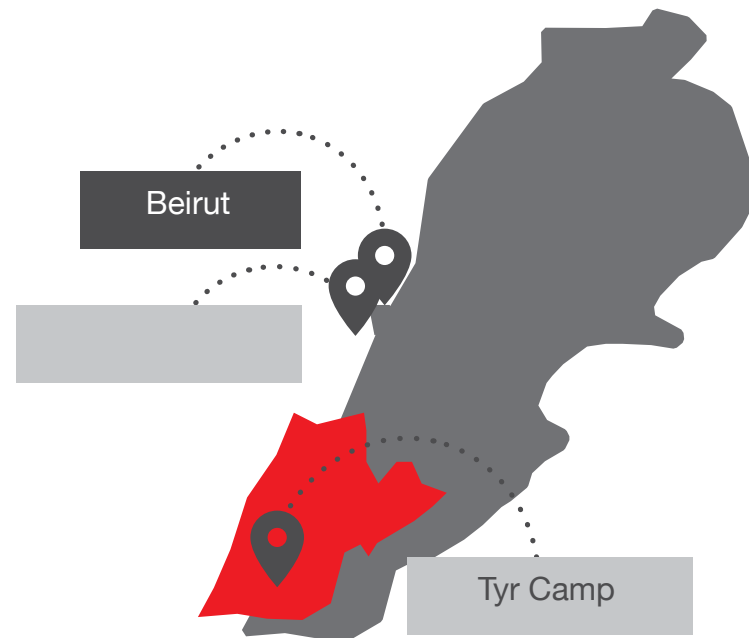

Most Palestinian refugees have lost their jobs since October 2019, and are currently heavily impacted by the economic crisis. Women & children are in a very tough situation, bearing the brunt of the crisis. PalWHO needs funding to cover elderly persons' care, provision of meals for families, running a community kitchen, and distributing hygiene and dignity kits, especially to women who no longer have access to such items.

### Social and medical care for older persons

daily visits to homes of older persons who cannot access clinics for medical services including daily check-ups, physiotherapy, distribution of medication and medical devices

### Reproductive and general healthcare for women

awareness-raising and information dissemination (especially among child brides), disease prevention initiatives

### Feeding programme

daily meals for children who are registered with the organisation

### Community awareness-raising

activities for women, men, and children (against child marriage with girls and mothers, COVID-19, social topics)

### Women's rights programme

(capacity building for the community and staff) through the centre

### Educational services

(including preschool education, remedial classes, basic literacy and numeracy, working with learning difficulties – physical disability)

### Needs-based relief

such as food parcels for Beirut blast victims and hygiene kits as COVID-19 response
